OU offers workshop on Middle Eastern American cultures

Oakland University's School of Education and Human Services (SEHS) will offer "Middle Eastern American Cultures," a workshop for educators and school personnel. The course will be held on Saturday, April 24, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. and continue on Sunday, April 25, from noon to 4 p.m. at the Cranbrook Institute of Science in Bloomfield Hills.

Sharon Pray-Muir, will lead the workshop. Pray-Muir is a social studies specialist who has lived and traveled in the Middle East. She also teaches a graduate course in multicultural education.

Participants will be introduced to the culture of Middle Eastern Americans, specifically those living in the Detroit area. Issues faced by schools, such as effective teaching, curricular accommodations, and communication with parents of Middle Eastern American students will be discussed. Middle Eastern religions, Christian, Jewish and Muslim; awareness of stereotypes; and ethnic American customs also will be addressed.

The cost of the workshop is \$195 if enrolled for continuing education units (CEUs). Participants have the option to take the course for one university graduate credit.
