#### **Tuf Francis Invited to Summit for Teacher Education**

Anthony Tuf Francis, assistant professor in the Department of Teacher Development and Educational Studies has recently been invited to be a panelist at a summit meeting at the University of Michigan.

TeachingWorks is partnering with the Branch Alliance for Teacher Educator Diversity (BranchED) to host a summit for teacher educators focused on practice-based teacher education on February 11-13, 2018. This event will bring together faculty



members from approximately ten minority-serving institutions (MSIs) and historically black colleges and university (HBCU's) from across the country, with the goal of introducing participants to practice-based teacher education and unpacking how it can be an effective framework for preparing beginning teachers.
