OU men's swimmer competes at NCAA meet

Oakland University swimmer Chris Sullivan finished 25th in the 50-yard freestyle and 41st in the 100-yard freestyle at the NCAA Championship in Athens, Georgia, last weekend.

Sullivan, a freshmen, swam a 20.04 for the 50-yard freestyle and was two-tenths of a second from qualifying for the final. He finished the 100-yard freestyle with a time of 44.85, missing the 44.07 needed to make the final.

The Rockford native recorded his best times of the year in the 50- and 100-free at the National Independent Conference Championship, where he became the first OU male swimmer to break the 20-second barrier in the 50-yard free, finishing first with a time of 19.96. He also qualified for the 100-yard freestyle at the NIC Championship, posting a time of 44.44.

Sullivan is the third OU athlete to qualify for the NCAA Swimming and Diving Championship since The Golden Grizzlies began competing at the Division I level three years ago. Last week, Oksana Strelets, a sophomore from Kazakhstan, was the second woman from OU to ever qualify for the NCAA Swimming and Diving Championship.
