
Recent interviews have featured Superintendent of Detroit Public Schools, Alicia Meriweather and Michael Fullan, author of over 30



M-231 Education Project: Digging Local History

Special Instructor in Social Studies education, Carol Egbo, and Michigan Indian Tribal partners have been awarded an MDOT grant that will support them in creating lesson plans and curriculum units centered around two archeological sites excavated by MDOT.

The M-231 Education Project will combine records and artifacts from the excavations with cultural, historical, environmental and indigenous knowledge. The lesson plans will be inquiry oriented;

designed using the College, Career, and Civic Life (C3) Framework from the National Council for the Social Studies.

Oakland University NCAA Baseball Game - April 26, 2017


On Wednesday, April 26, at 6 p.m., Jimmy John's field is hosting their first ever NCAA Division baseball game.
