ACCOLADES AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Office of Public School Acadmies Presents at MAASE Summer Institute

Shawna Boomgaard, manager of academic accountability; and Adam LeRoy, administrative coordinator for special services, were selected to present at the Michigan Association of Administrators of Special Education (MAASE) 2017 Summer Institute on August 7, at the Grand Traverse Resort in Acme, MI.

The conference design aligned with the MAASE strategic priorities and focused on: high quality student evaluations, specially designed instruction, skilled staff, and program evaluation. The conference keynote speaker was Dr. Todd Whitaker, author of over 30 books, including the national best seller, *What Great Teachers Do Differently*, and is one of the nation's leading authorities on staff motivation, teacher leadership, and principal effectiveness.

Shawna and Adam's presentation, *Teacher Perception of Students and Refugee Status,* addressed the specially designed instruction and skilled staff elements. They conducted a phenomenological, qualitative research study which asked teachers to respond to four



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questions on experiences with students and four on access to resources. Results showed that although teachers' approach included a framework of empathy and child advocacy, their roles in the classroom and lives of refugee students often led to increased feelings of isolation or lack of support. This was largely due to minimal availability of information about the experiences of refugee students, which presented a major barrier for teachers in the classroom. Additionally, they determined that there is minimal research and information on the experiences of English Learners teachers, specifically those working with refugee students, which



limits staff skills. Suggested ways to mitigate these factors included changes in curriculum program design and professional development opportunities; including grant funding and collaborating with local agencies.
