ENROLLMENT EXPECTED TO HIT 6,000 THIS FALL

An estimated 6,000 students, which would be an increase of 900 over 1968, are expected to enroll this week for the start of the fall term. Special programs of orientation week include Convocation for New Students and Parents, to be held at 8 p.m. Tuesday in Baldwin Pavilion; lectures by Leroy Augenstein, chairman of the department of biophysics at MSU, on "Shall We Play God?," at 1 and 3 p.m. Wednesday in Wilson Auditorium, and special showings of the movie "Charly" at 7 and 9 p.m. Wednesday in the Hills Theatre in Rochester. Both the movie and Augenstein's address are based on the book assigned for this year's preview seminars, "Flowers for Algernon."

Other orientation week highlights include a blues concert at 9 p.m. Friday in Baldwin Pavilion, featuring the Butterfield Blues Band and the Steve Miller Band, and "The Splash"--a combined pool party, concert and dance--at 8 p.m. Saturday in the Sports and Recreation Building. Juniors and seniors register on Wednesday, sophomores on Thursday, and freshmen on Thursday and Friday. All classes will begin September 8.
