

# Alumni Fund Drive Shatters Records

Oakland University alumni shattered the 1974 fund drive total exceeding the goal by 64 percent. The drive ran from May 1 through Jan. 31, 1974.

The total was \$16,494 compared with a goal of \$10,000, Elaine Petz, director of the Office of Alumni Relations, reports. Included in the total is \$1,400 raised through the annual Friends of Oakland Swimming Meet.

Individual contributors numbered 997 this year compared with 306 in 1973, and corporate matching gifts from 35 firms came to \$1,305. There were 23 gifts for \$836 in 1973.

In addition, Pioneer Club membership climbed from 47 members in 1973 to 83 in 1974. Pioneer Club members give \$50 or more to the institution during a given fund drive year.

## Nine Students Get Research Funds

Nine Oakland University students have received grants of up to \$150 each to support undergraduate research projects at the university.

The awards are made competitively by the University Research Committee from funds contributed by the OU Alumni Association.

Each student researcher is sponsored by a faculty advisor from his or her major discipline. The winners must submit a final report on their research projects.

The winners are: Candice K. Dana, Rochester, \$100 for research on "The Sanilac Petroglyph Site"; Gerard T. Donnelly, Clarkston, \$150 for research on "The Effects of Ultra-Violet Irradiation on Rape (seed plants) O°C"; Daniel Dziedzic, Detroit, \$150 to support his study of "Ultrastructural Cyto-

chemistry of Normal and Cataractous Lenses"; and David A. Gallup, Bloomfield Hills, \$34 for research on "The Tissue Transplant Tool."

Other winners are: James B. Harries, Royal Oak, \$100 for research on "The Developmental Significance of the Michigan Lumber Industry: A Statistical Analysis, 1860-1900"; Daniel H. Johnson, Pontiac, \$150 for a study of the "Regulatory Mechanisms of Urate Oxidase in *Drosophila Melanogaster*"; Debra K. Neville, Rochester, \$110 for research on "A Validity Measure of Personality Tests"; and Valjean Simson, Pontiac, and Bruce Badagliacqua, Detroit, \$150 to support their research on "A Study of the Role of Metabolism in the Function of the Retina."

Dr. Geraldene Felton has been appointed professor of nursing and dean of Oakland University's new School of Nursing.

Frederick W. Obear, academic vice president and provost, said the new dean is directing final planning for the B.S.N. program that the university plans to offer in the fall of 1975. Some 300 students have already enrolled for a year of pre-nursing study at the institution.

"Dr. Felton's extensive record as a

nursing educator and practitioner, researcher and administrator is exceptionally strong," Obear said. "Nursing appears to be one of our programs with the widest student interest, and I now feel confident that we have a capable dean to guide the development of that program."

Dr. Felton is nationally known in nursing education and nursing research. She is a Lieutenant Colonel in the U.S. Army Nurse Corps, and her most recent position was as research nurse and deputy director of the Division of Nursing, Walter Reed Army Institute of Research, Washington, D.C. and clinical associate professor at Georgetown University School of Nursing. Before going to Walter Reed, she was research assistant at Wayne State University, Detroit, Michigan and an assistant and associate professor at the University of Hawaii School of Nursing in Honolulu, on special assignment from the Army Nurse Corps. She was also staff nurse and anesthetist at St. Joseph's Mercy Hospital in Pontiac from 1956 to 1960.

Dr. Felton was born in Norfolk, Virginia, received her primary and

secondary education in Philadelphia, Pa., and a diploma in nursing from Mercy Hospital, Philadelphia. She has a doctorate in education (1969) from New York University, a master of science (1962) and a bachelor of science degree (1960), both in nursing, and both from Wayne State University.

She is a Charter Fellow of the Academy of Nursing and member of the Joint Committee of the American Nurses' Association Council on Nursing Research and the Commission on Nursing. Formerly, she was a member of the Board of Directors of the American Journal of Nursing Company, Vice-Chairperson of WCHEN, Consultant to Regional Medical Programs, and secretary of the Hawaii Nurses' Association. She is a member of the Manuscript Review Panel of the Journal of Nursing Research. She has authored many articles and published proceedings. Presently, she is engaged in several collaborative research projects, serves as technical advisor on films on patient teaching and acts as a consultant in nursing education, nursing research, evaluation, and quality appraisal.

## University Opens Infant-Parent Observation Center

Parents traditionally boast about their babies, but even then they often underestimate their infants' abilities.

This idea is behind a new infant/parent observation center established at Oakland University. The center is operated under auspices of the university's nationally recognized early childhood education program, and it is located in St. John Fisher Chapel on Walton Blvd.

The age of four months to one year is a critical period in an infant's life, claims Marie Gormaine, center director. It is a time when babies learn at a tremendous rate, she said.

The center is designed to help parents better understand their infants during this learning period. Through this understanding parents can do much to help develop the infants' motor skills and over-all growth, the director said.

In a pilot program held in October, eight babies between the ages of four and 12 months were accepted at the center along with their mothers. During a six-week period, the babies' play habits and behavioral characteristics were observed by their parents and center personnel.

A second program began in January with 10 parents and their children enrolled. Fifteen more parents are on a waiting list, and they will be accepted with their children for a spring program at the center.

During the sessions, parents are encouraged to interact with the infants through communication and simple games. Toys of varying complexity are introduced to stimulate the infant's intellect and use of motor skills.

Gormaine has operated nursery schools for the past 22 years. She is

directing the infant/parent observation center as an independent study project for her master's degree in early childhood education. Professor Doris Sponseller, director of early childhood education, supervises the project.

The early childhood master's degree program was developed with the aid of \$48,000 in funding received through last spring from the U.S. Office of Education. The program has been cited in Washington as a programmatic model.

As part of their course work, graduate students have established campus toddler programs for children between the ages of one and two years of age and a child care center for children between the ages of two and one-half and five years of age. Similar programs have been operated by the graduate students in neighboring communities.

## Swimmers Set Sights on NCAA Championships

Oakland's swimming coach Corey Van Fleet hopes to improve on last years, best ever, seventh place finish at the N.C.A.A. Division II National Championships and possibly win it all when the meet begins on March 20 in Cleveland, Ohio. 
## 1974
