OAKLAND UNIVERSITY

Oakland University is a state-funded, four-year institution with an enrollment of more than 11,500 students. Located midway between Rochester and Pontiac, Michigan, the university is approximately 30 miles from all the cultural and entertainment opportunities of America's fifth largest city—Detroit.

Oakland University was founded in 1957 when the late Mr. and Mrs. Alfred G. Wilson donated their 1,600-acre estate and \$2 million to Michigan State University to begin a new college in Oakland County. The university, named Michigan State-Oakland, enrolled its first students in 1959. In 1963 the name was changed to Oakland University and in 1970 the state legislature granted Oakland University its independence.

Since its inception, the university has been committed to offering a diverse set of academic programs. Anchored by a strong liberal arts program, the university is organized into a College of Arts and Sciences, and Schools of Economics and Management, Human and Educational Services, Performing Arts, Engineering, Nursing, a Center for General and Career Studies, a Center for Health Sciences, and a Center for Community and Human Development.

The athletic program strives for continued success in achieving its educational goal of providing total participation within a framework of excellence. Under the guidance of the Director of Athletics Corey Van Fleet, Oakland University's athletic department has 12 sports and offers cardio-vascular rehabilitation and physiology laboratory programs including prescriptive exercises and stress testing.

The Hollie Lepley Sports Center houses a range of facilities for individual and team activities including: a swimming pool; courts for handball, paddleball, badminton, squash, basketball and volleyball; a wrestling room; and an updated weight room. There is also an 18-hole golf course, eight excellent outdoor tennis courts and several well-groomed playing fields. These facilities combined with the university's beautiful wooded landscape and rolling fields make the Oakland campus one of the most ideal environments for sports activities.

Oakland University is a member of the NCAA Division II and the AIAW Division I and the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference. Its academic programs are accredited by the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools.

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MEN'S BASKETBALL OUTLOOK

Looking for its first winning season since the 1973-74 campaign, there is a new aura around the Oakland University men's basketball program this season. It is something that you can't see or measure but you know it's there.

Head coach Lee Frederick enters his second full season at the helm of the Pioneers' cage program with the assistance from coach Steve Hebold. Frederick took charge of the OU basketball team at mid-year of the 1978-79 season and compiled a 6-7 record. Last year his 13-14 mark boosted his career record at OU to 19-21.

The 19-21 record is expected to change this season as the 36-year-old head coach brought in six newcomers, all from winning programs. On the front line, there are freshmen Larry Lubitz and Mike Mohn along with sophomore transfer Tom Blythe, while in the backcourt Frederick will take a close look at freshman Lamar Ragland, from two-time state champion Detroit East Catholic High School, and junior college transfer Anthony Barnard. Freshman Rob Manilla is slated for action as a swingman.

Add these six newcomers to a cast of eight returning lettermen and Frederick hopes that this formulates a winning season. Rich Brauer, an all-conference selection and the Pioneers' leading scorer and rebounder last year, and Bill Peterson, last year's most valuable player, return as starting forwards, while senior guards Les Thomas and K.C. Forward also return. Thomas was the Pioneers' second leading scorer, while Forward, OU's playmaking guard, led the team in assists.

Also returning from last year's 13-14 squad are sharpshooter Dennis Hammond who can hit the bullseye from 25 feet, forward Duane Glenn, and senior guards Mark Mendez and Clyde Montgomery.

COREY VAN FLEET

Director of Athletics

Corey Van Fleet was named director of athletics at Oakland University in 1972. Upon his arrival at OU in 1965, he was swimming coach for the Pioneers until 1979 when he stepped down to devote his full-time duties to the ever-increasing job of director of athletics.

He has, however, remained active in swimming on the high school level by serving as an official at high school meets. He also officiates for the Big Ten Conference, the National Collegiate

Athletic Association (NCAA), the Amateur Athletic Union (AAU) meets, and the Olympic Trials.

A native of Battle Creek, Michigan, he received his bachelor of science degree (1959) and his master of science degree (1971) in physical education from Wayne State University. He also has completed course work in a doctoral program at Florida State University.

His recent honors include: the Matt Mann Swimming Coach Award from the Michigan High School Coaches Association; appointment to the board of directors, American Red Cross, U.S. Olympic Swimming Committee; the Master Coach Award from the Michigan Amateur Athletic Union. Van Fleet is also a member of the YMCA National Aquatics Board of Directors, a member of the Rochester Rotary Club, past president of the College Swimming Coaches of America, Inc., and an active member in the NCAA and AIAW governing bodies.

An associate professor of education with tenure, Van Fleet and his wife, Mary, have one son and live in Rochester.

GREG SMITH

Sports Information Director

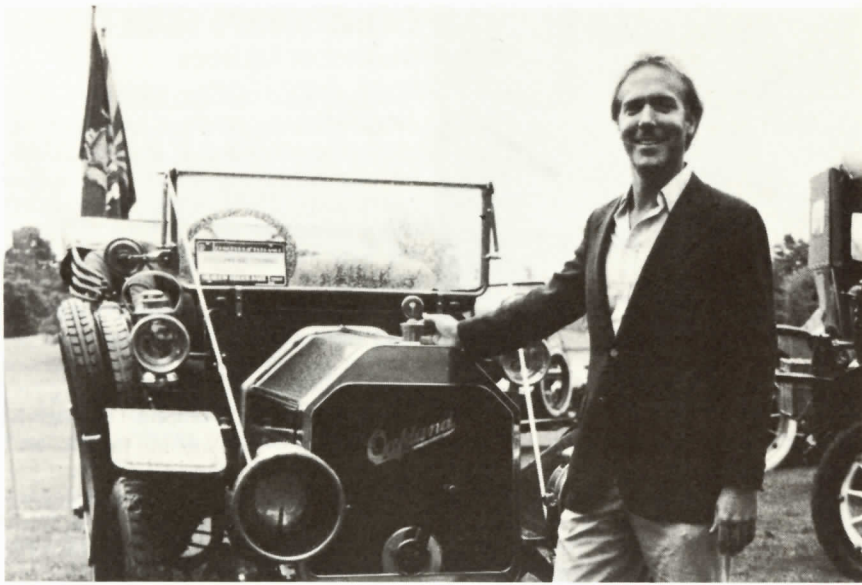
Greg Smith is in his second year as sports information director at Oakland University after serving for two years as SID at Valparaiso University in Valparaiso, Indiana.

Smith's 1980 OU swimming brochure was judged second-best in the nation by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA).

The 25-year-old SID received his Bachelor of Science degree in Public Relations Journalism in 1977 from Bowling Green State University (BGSU) in Bowling Green, Ohio. While a student at BGSU, he was a sports information assistant for four years, assistant sports editor for the **BG News**, the campus newspaper, and a sports writer for the **Bowling Green Sentinel-Tribune**. He was also president and founder of the Sports Information Club at BGSU. In addition, his experience includes sports writing for the **Findlay Courier**.

HEAD COACH LEE FREDERICK

Lee Frederick begins his second full season as head basketball coach at Oakland University this year. The 36-year-old coach took over the head coaching reins in mid-season during the 1978-79 year and guided the Pioneers to a 6-7 record before last year's 13-14 mark.

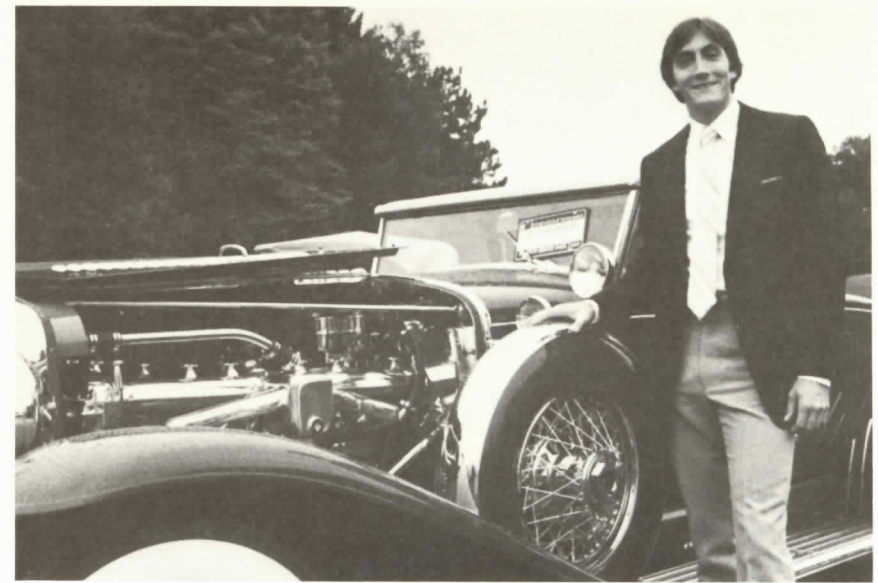
Beginning his fifth year at Oakland University, Frederick was an assistant basketball coach at Northern Michigan University and Western Illinois University before coming to OU. He was also the tennis coach at OU for the 1977-79 seasons and compiled a 49-19 record for a 72.1 winning percentage.

A former all-state player in Illinois, he was a member of the varsity team at Bradley University, where he earned his bachelor and master degrees in psychology. He was also a member of the Bradley University basketball team that won the National Invitational Tournament in 1964.

Frederick has written one book and five articles on a variety of basketball subjects including: **How to Play One on One Basketball**, Sand River Press 1972; "The Basketball Season, NCAA News, May 15, 1972; "Personality Testing of Athletes; Fact or Fiction," the NABC Bulletin, December 1973; "Amateur Basketball and the 30-second Clock; An argument Against Their Marriage," the NABC Bulletin, December 1974; "The High Percentage Stab Shot," Scholastic Coach, October 1976; and "Basketball Camps: Where Do We Go From Here?" the NABC Bulletin, October, 1977.

He has run his own "One on One Basketball Schools" in Illinois for seven years and for two summers he took his unique approach to the game to Sweden and Denmark where he met outstanding success with the basketball federations of those countries.

Frederick and his wife, Sue, have two children and live in Rochester.



COACH STEVE HEBOLD

Steve Hebold is a man that wears many different hats for Oakland University. Starting his fifth year at OU, Hebold will again assist head basketball coach Lee Frederick in practice, recruiting, and scouting. He will serve as head cross-country coach in the fall as well.

A 1970 graduate of Kimball High School in Royal Oak, Michigan, he gained Southeastern Michigan Association honors in both football and basketball and also participated in baseball and track. Hebold averaged 22.0 points and once scored a career-high 35 points during his high school career. He also gained all-Oakland County and all-state honors and was named team captain during his senior year.

Hebold attended the University of North Dakota on a basketball scholarship after receiving approximately 12 scholarship offers. He played on the varsity team as a freshman and had a season-high 28 points in one game. A preseason massive heart attack at the age of 21 cut short his collegiate basketball career. After a complete recovery he finished his studies at Western Michigan University in 1975. Hebold was the assistant coach for one year at Birmingham Brother Rice High School, where he has taught English and accounting for the last five years.

A veteran of numerous summer basketball camps, Hebold directs the Oakland University summer basketball camp. He also played professional basketball in South America in 1977 as well as in the foreign countries of Canada, Venezuela, England, Greece, Austria, and Czechoslovakia.

Hebold and his wife, Cam, sister of OU basketball player Rob Manilla, live in Lake Orion.

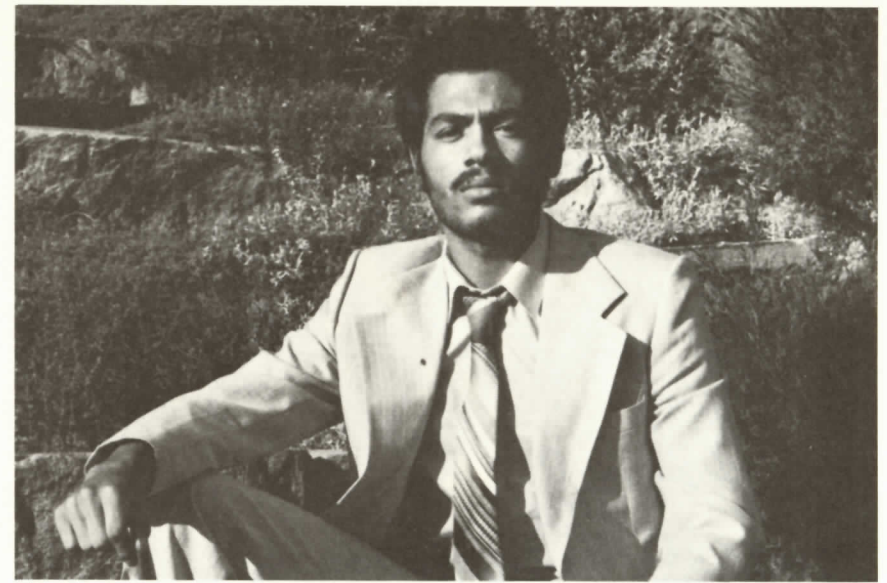


3 LES THOMAS

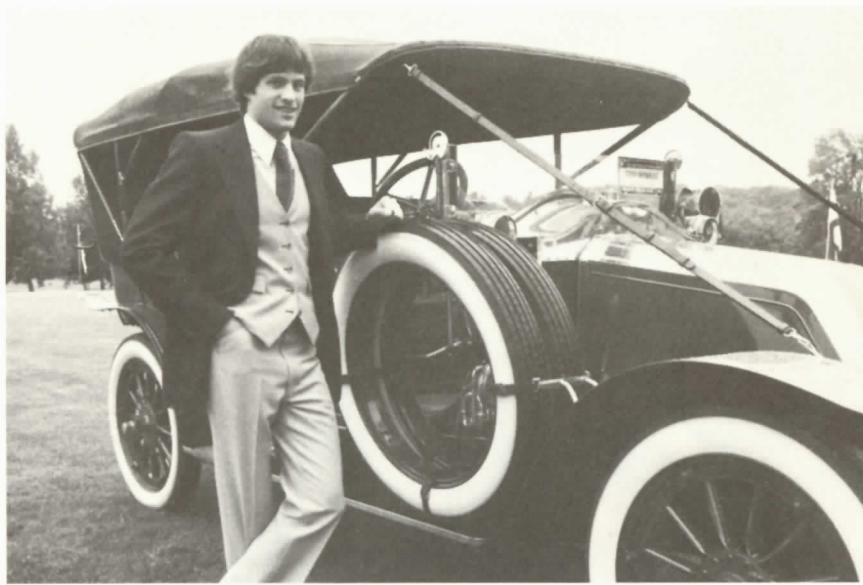
