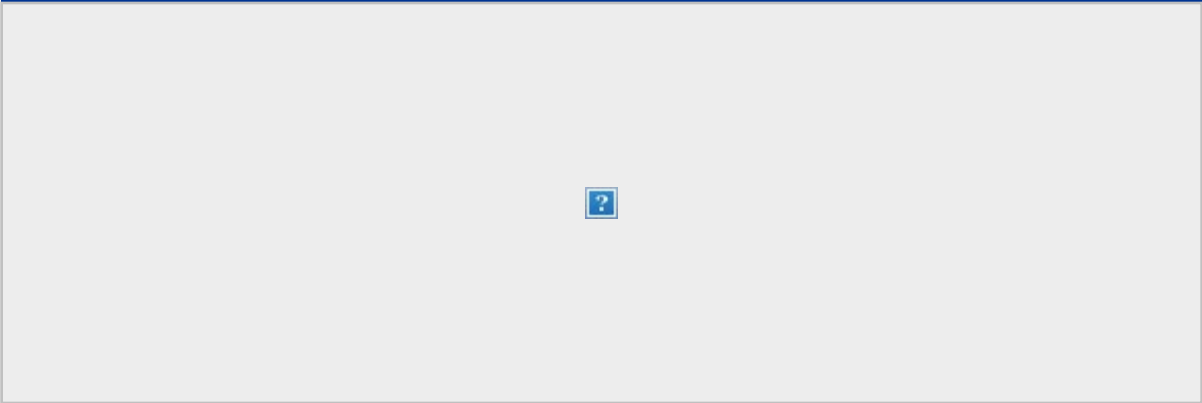

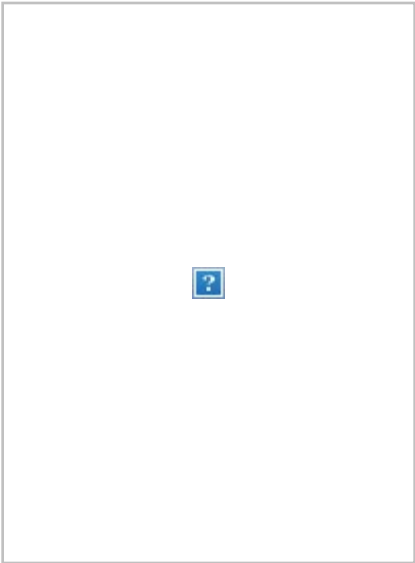


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Collection Spotlight: Resources from Medical Education Week

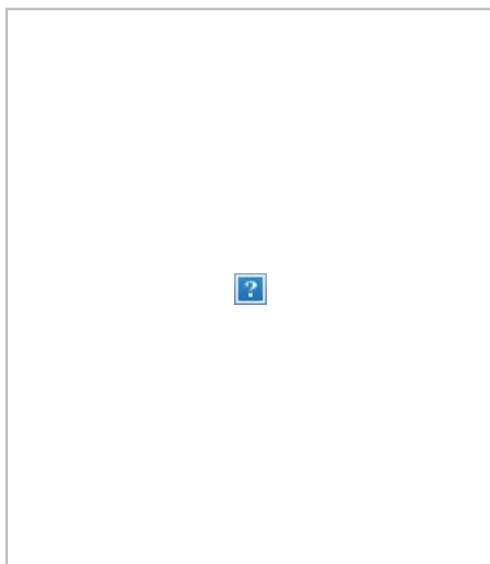

PubMed Search Tip of the Month: Searching with MeSH Terms

MeSH stands for Medical Subject Headings. It is a specific list of terms used to describe the content of each article indexed in MEDLINE, the main component of PubMed. Incorporating MeSH terms into your search strategy will help focus your results.

There are several ways to locate and include MeSH terms into your searches. The two most common are described below:

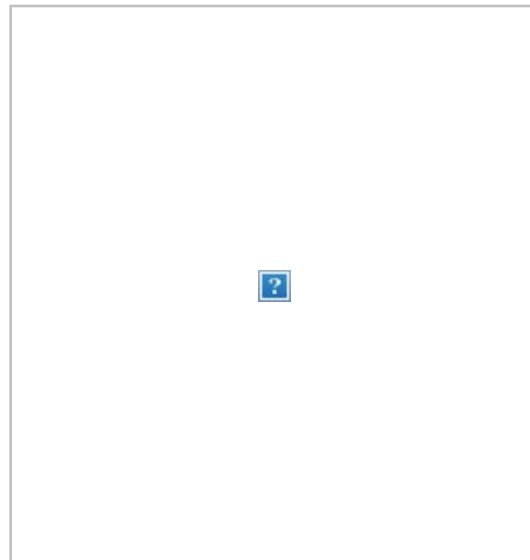
OPTION 1: Search the MeSH Database Directly

1. Click 'Mesh Database' on the main PubMed search page
2. Search a term. Let's say I am interested in new methods of cataract surgery. A search of the MeSH database mapped my term to the correct MeSH term, "Cataract Extraction."
3. You can focus your search by selecting subheadings, such as 'Methods'
4. Click the 'Add to search builder' button
5. Click 'Search PubMed' to return to PubMed and run your MeSH search



OPTION 2: Browse MeSH Terms Assigned to Relevant Articles

1. Run a keyword search in PubMed and locate a relevant article on your topic.
2. To see the MeSH terms assigned to that article, either click the article title OR click 'Format' > 'Abstract' near the PubMed search box
3. Select the dropdown menu that says 'Publication types, MeSH terms, Substances, Grant support'
4. Right click on the MeSH term that looks most important to your topic, and select the 'Search in PubMed' option.



Just remember that MeSH terms may take several months to be assigned to articles in PubMed so very recent articles may not have assigned MeSH terms.
