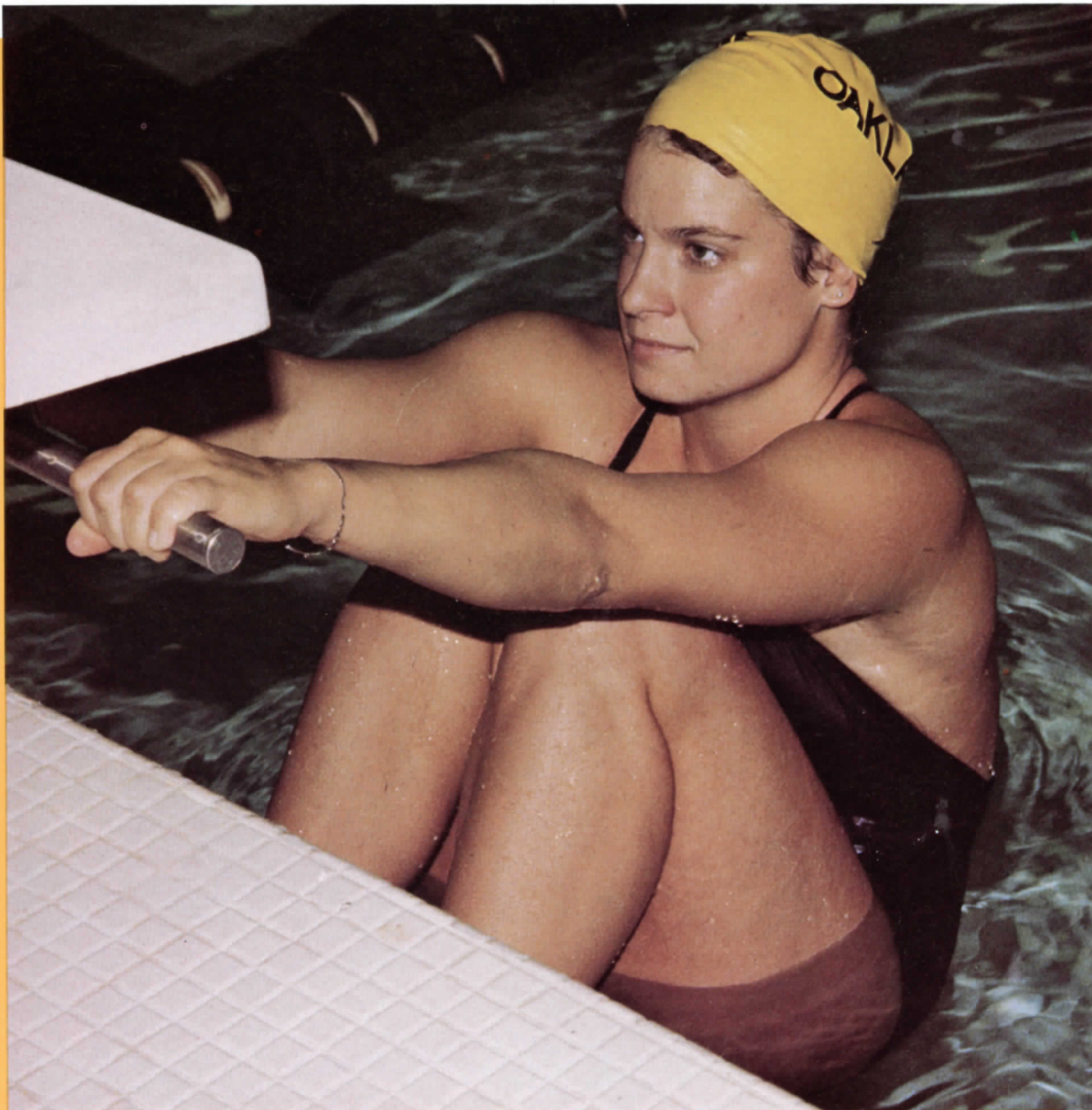
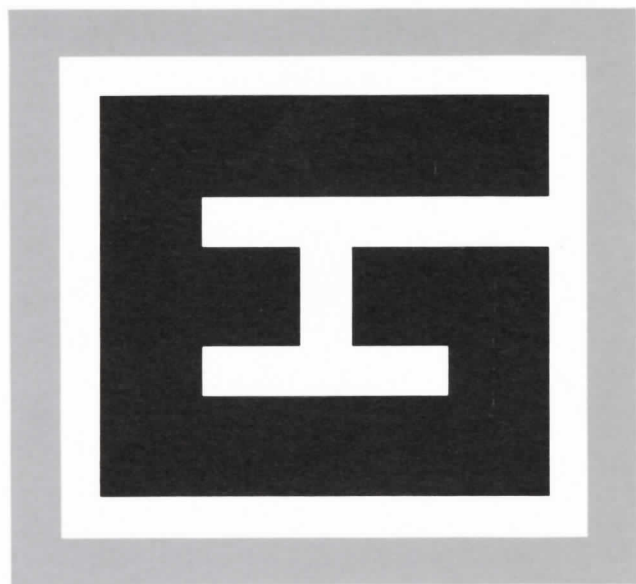

In 1957, the late Alfred G. and Matilda R. Wilson donated \$2 million and their 1,500-acre Meadow Brook Farms estate, 30 miles north of Detroit, to Michigan State University to establish a college in Oakland County. Classes began in 1959 with 570 first-year students. In 1970, Oakland University became an independent public university, and its formal association with Michigan State ended.

Today, with some 27,000 graduates, Oakland University enrolls 12,000 students in its bachelor's, master's and doctoral degree programs. The 24-member charter faculty has grown to more than 400, 90 percent of whom hold earned doctorates.

With distinct instructional programs (College of Arts and Sciences, School of Economics and Management, School of Engineering and Computer Science, School of Human and Educational Services, School of Nursing, Center for Health Sciences), the institution offers a diverse curriculum of general education and specific career fields. Virtually all courses are taught by faculty members, not teaching assistants.

Academic support facilities include such notable entities as the Institute of Biological Sciences (which includes the V. Everett Kinsey Memorial Laboratory, the only major eye research center in the United States not connected with a medical school), the exercise physiology laboratory and the Center for Robotics and Advanced Automation. The Honors College was established to meet the educational needs of highly motivated students.

PAUL HARTMAN *Athletic Director*

Paul Hartman is starting his second year as director of athletics for Oakland University. A veteran administrator, Hartman has continued to develop Oakland's tradition of athletic excellence.

The program added personnel, developed additional summer youth camps and offered a new season ticket plan in his first year. He also instituted a Hall of Honor for exceptional Pioneer athletes and introduced the first athletic team banquet.

Hartman, who replaced Corey Van Fleet in June 1983, served the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point as athletic director for seven years prior to moving to Oakland University. He also served in similar positions at Florida International University in Miami, Florida, and Plymouth State College in New Hampshire.

RON FORBES *Business Manager*

Ron Forbes, a native of Royal Oak, Michigan, and graduate of Western Michigan University, handles the duties of business manager for the athletic department. Entering his 15th year at Oakland, he is also in charge of ticket receipts.

STAN BLACKFORD *Sports Information Director*

Stan Blackford is entering his third year as sports information director for the athletic department. A native of Evansville, Indiana, he has spent six years working in college athletics.

TOM VAN VOORHIS *Marketing and Promotions Director*

Tom Van Voorhis handles promotions and marketing for the athletic department. A retired public relations employee from General Motors, Van Voorhis sells advertising, arranges special game promotions and schedules speaking engagements for the Pioneer coaching staff. He is a graduate of the University of Michigan.

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MARY ELLEN WYDAN

Head Women's Swimming Coach

First-year head coach Mary Ellen Wydan posted a winning record the hard way for Oakland University in 1983-84. After losing five straight meets to open the dual-meet season, Wydan's Pioneers bounced back to win six straight meets, including three over National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Division II universities.

As though that wasn't enough, Wydan directed one of the smallest groups of national qualifiers to an incredible fourth-place finish in the NCAA Division II Women's Championships.

The 23-year-old Wydan, who spent two years as an assistant men's and women's swimming coach at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill before arriving at Oakland, coached a national-record-holding relay team and Mary Vincent gained the Pioneers' first national championship in diving.

A native of Lansdale, Pennsylvania, Wydan worked with North Carolina distance swimmers to produce some outstanding achievements. Polly Winde and Sue Walsh, key members of the Tar Heels' sixth-place national finish in the NCAA Division II championship meet, qualified for the Pan-American Games. Walsh was triple champion for North Carolina.

Wydan was a high-school star at North Penn High School, earning most-valuable-swimmer honors all four years, and was a prep All-American three times.



She attended Pennsylvania State University and was a national qualifier on the Nittany Lions 400-yard freestyle relay team before transferring to Delaware in 1979.

In addition to her coaching duties with Oakland, Wydan works closely with the Oakland Live Y'ers swimming program, which has 200 individual participants at several different age-group levels.

KAREN ENNEKING

Assistant Women's Coach

Karen Enneking, the first Oakland Division I All-American in women's swimming, joins the Pioneers this year as assistant coach.

A Dearborn, Michigan, native, Enneking earned a total of eight individual Division II All-American honors. In 1983 she captured national titles in 50 and

200 breaststroke events. Her time of 2:25.26 in the 200 set a national record.

Enneking also played major roles on the 1984 200 and 400 medley relay teams, which earned All-American honors.

After finishing fourth in the 1983-84 National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Division II Swimming Championships, Oakland University head coach Mary Ellen Wydan feels the chemistry and elements of her new Pioneers puts them in position to improve on last year's national finish.

Wydan did an excellent coaching job last year by maintaining her poise as her squad dropped five straight dual meets before beating three NCAA Division I schools (Purdue, Cleveland State and Michigan) and turning in six straight victories to finish with a 6-5 overall dual-meet mark. Wydan's squad maintained its confidence to place fourth nationally with one of the smallest teams in the championship meet.

"The confidence we built last year is what we want to build upon this season," Wydan said. "We are setting long- and short-range goals again so they will peak for the championships."

The Pioneers appear to have a solid foundation of standouts despite the graduation losses of All-Americans Karen Enneking and one-meter diving champion Mary Vincent. Enneking has been a top national finisher for the last four years in breaststroke events.

Backstroke specialist Kathy VanValkenburg will be shooting to make All-American honors and rewrite her school records in the 100-yard and 200 backstroke. Freestylers Kim Pogue will be aiming for the same goals in the 500 and 1650 events. These two may well hold the keys to the Pioneer swimming program this season.

Three others that should be factors for the Pioneers will be freestylers Bonnie Gleffe and Linda Scott and individual medley performer Sarah Stanwood, who sat out the 1983-84 season. Stanwood was the 200 individual medley national champion among NCAA Division III swimmers in 1981-82 for Hope College before transferring to Oakland.

"We are a cohesive unit and that can act as a catalyst to produce the right chemistry," Wydan said. "The personalities and different strokes of our swimmers give us a good blend of highly motivated individuals."

Along with a strong recruiting class, Wydan enters this season with six high-school recruits who should help the program.

"The freshmen recruits should upgrade our talent level," Wydan said. "The new cast of Nancy Schermer, Kim Brace, Lee Ann O'Neil, Michelle Derdaele, Paula Censoni and Allison Klump gives us elements that will improve our overall depth and strength."

Schermer's prep times in the 100, 200 and 500 freestyles would meet NCAA Division II qualification standards for the national meet and her 200 time stands within the top six in last year's championship.

The Pioneers' solid blend of veterans and upstart freshmen should make this year's unit bid for a top-five finish at the NCAA Division II meet a distinct possibility.

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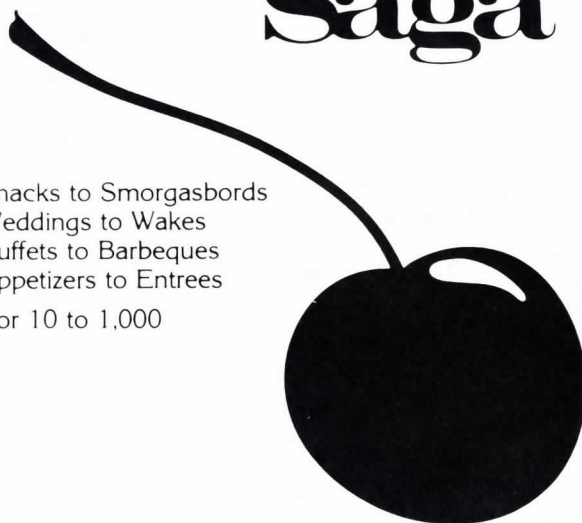

One of the best sprint freestyle swimmers in the country . . . lived up to his high-school times by qualifying for the NCAA in the 50, 100 and 200 freestyle . . . earned All-American honors with 10th-place finish in the NCAA Division II Championships in the 50 freestyle (21.36) and was a member of Oakland's 400 freestyle relay team that earned All-American status . . . pool record holder in the 50 (21.38) and 100 (46.87) freestyles . . . 1984 GLIAC champion in the 50 freestyle (21.80) and a member of the victorious 800 freestyle relay (7:03.30) . . . should blossom into one of the best sprint freestylers in Oakland University's history next year . . . was the second-fastest sprint freestyler in Michigan's class "A" competition before attending Oakland . . . 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The Tracy Huth era at Oakland University came to an end last spring, much to the relief of many Division II swimming programs.

Huth, who was a three-time National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Division II Swimmer of the Year and national record holder in two events, spearheaded a contingent of strong Pioneer swimmers that finished second in the NCAA Division II Championships three of the last four years.

Along with Huth, the Pioneers lost All-American swimmers Darin Abbasse, Mike Schmidt, Alan Faust, Mike McCloskey and Craig Chappel. These players will be hard to replace, but the Pioneers still have some of the best talent in the country.

Senior John Christiansen, juniors Jeff Colton and Matt Croghan and sophomore Steve Larson will be the main point winners for the Pioneers and are veterans with potential to crack 1985 All-American lists.

Head coach Pete Hovland would also like to see junior Jeff Pryor and sophomores Steve Hussey and Tim Walilko improve on last year's times.

With a strong recruiting year, the Pioneers improved in freestyle and breaststroke events. Mike Koleber (Washington, Michigan) spent a year with the United States Naval Academy swim program before coming back to the Rochester campus. He should add depth to the freestyle along with Swartz Creek High School product Jeff Cooper.

Hovland also recruited two outstanding breaststroke swimmers who should give Oakland its best times since Tom Allen scored at the NCAA meet in 1980. It has been four years since Allen's exploits, but class "A" 100 breaststroke champion Jeff Kuhn (East Kentwood, Michigan) and runner-up Mark VanderMey (Grandville, Michigan) have the potential to finish among the nation's top six in breaststroke events.

"This group of recruits reminds me of the Faust, Abbasse, Schmidt and Chappell freshman class," Hovland said. "Ernie and I didn't think much of it at the time, but that class developed into the backbone of the team."

This year's recruiting class isn't the backbone of the team, but they should help the Pioneer quest for an unprecedented eighth-straight Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC) championship and a top-five finish at the NCAA Division II championship meet.

The Pioneers have never finished lower than seventh since 1975 at the NCAA Division II meet. This year should be a wide-open scramble among the nation's top swimming programs.

"California State University, Northridge is the clear-cut favorite and I would vote Puget Sound College next because of its returnees," Hovland said. "I think we'll be fighting with several teams for third through seventh places at the national meet."

Although this is a rebuilding year, the Pioneer tradition makes Hovland's team a threat in the GLIAC and NCAA championship meets.

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TRACY HUTH*Assistant Coach*

Tracy Huth, a four-time NCAA Division II national champion in the 200 and 400 individual medley and the first swimmer in history to accomplish that feat, will be serving as an assistant coach on the Pioneer coaching staff this year.

Huth holds the national record in the 200 individual medley (1:52.39) and 400 individual medley (4:00.17). The Yakima native — a three-time NCAA Division II Swimmer of the Year and 24-time All-American — was only the second swimmer to earn than many honors in NCAA history.

MIKE SCHMIDT*Assistant Coach*

Mike Schmidt, the 1983 1650 freestyle national champion (15:49.66), will serve on the Pioneer coaching staff this year.

An outstanding distance swimmer, Schmidt holds school records for the 500 freestyle (4:34.15) and 1650 freestyle (15:49.66).

Schmidt is an 11-time All-American.

DON MASON*Men's and Women's Diving Coach*

Don Mason, three-meter diving champion in 1981 among Division II divers for Wayne State University and diving coach for a half year, has been appointed to the Oakland University coaching staff as diving coach.

A four-year letter winner for the Tartars, Mason has produced four All-Americans in diving at Wayne State, including Susan and Lisa Giershick.

The Bloomfield Hills native won both boards in the GLIAC in 1980-81. He was also a seven-time All-American at Wayne State.

Mason, 24, also directs the Precision Diving Association, based in the Farmington and Livonia area. Mason is planning to move this two-year program to Oakland in September and merge it with the Oakland Live Y'ers Swimming Club.

The Pioneer diving program had one All-American last year. Senior Mary Vincent won the Division II one-meter diving championship last season.

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PETE HOVLAND

Head Coach

Pete Hovland, Oakland University's head men's swimming coach, has enjoyed three outstanding seasons and has had the Pioneers in contention for the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Division II swimming championship.

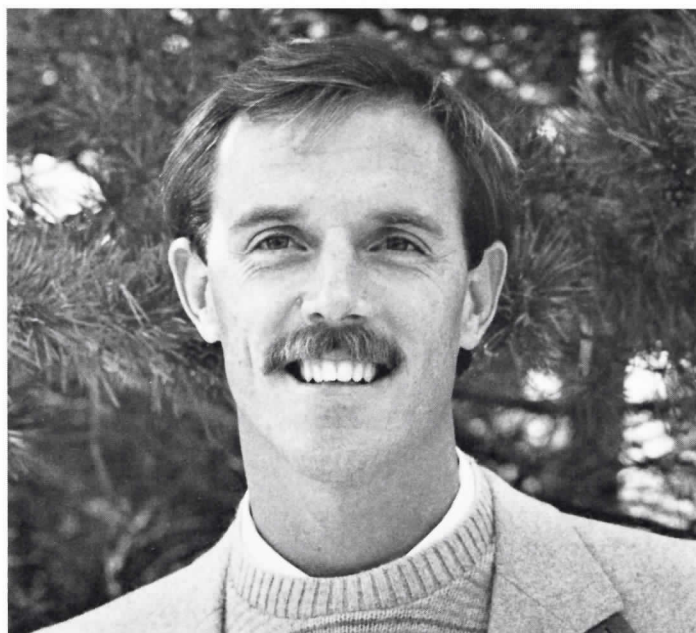
Entering his fourth year at the helm, Hovland has posted a 25-10-1 record, won three straight Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC) championships and finished runner-up twice and third once at the NCAA Division II Championships.

Hovland, who had the Pioneers ranked first in the 1983-84 Swimming Coaching Poll, missed winning the 1982-83 NCAA Swimming Championships by one-half second in the last event. Last season, several key swimmers were sick for the national meet and the Pioneers had to settle for second place once again.

Voted 1983 NCAA Coach of the Year, Hovland has done an outstanding job of keeping Oakland among the nation's elite.

The Pioneers won their only national championship in any sport in 1980 with Hovland as an assistant. Seven records remain from 1980 to indicate the upgrading of talent that continues to be recruited by Hovland.

A 23-time All-American at California State University, Chico in Chico, California, Hovland worked as an assistant to Ernie Maglischo before taking over the reins in 1981.



Hovland and Maglischo's relationship dates back to 1972 at California-Chico. While at California-Chico, Hovland won five national championship titles, participated in eight national title relay teams and was Western Conference Swimmer of the Year in 1977.

Hovland earned his bachelor's degree in physical education from Chico in 1977 and his master's degree in physical education from the University of Northern Iowa in 1979.

Paul Hartman is starting his second year as director of athletics for Oakland University. A veteran administrator, Hartman has continued to develop Oakland's tradition of athletic excellence.

The program added personnel, developed additional summer youth camps and offered a new season ticket plan in his first year. He also instituted a Hall of Honor for exceptional Pioneer athletes and introduced the first athletic team banquet.

Hartman, who replaced Corey Van Fleet in June 1983, served the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point as athletic director for seven years prior to moving to Oakland University. He also served in similar positions at Florida International University in Miami, Florida, and Plymouth State College in New Hampshire.

In 1957, the late Alfred G. and Matilda R. Wilson donated \$2 million and their 1,500-acre Meadow Brook Farms estate, 30 miles north of Detroit, to Michigan State University to establish a college in Oakland County. Classes began in 1959 with 570 first-year students. In 1970, Oakland University became an independent public university, and its formal association with Michigan State ended.

Today, with some 27,000 graduates, Oakland University enrolls 12,000 students in its bachelor's, master's and doctoral degree programs. The 24-member charter faculty has grown to more than 400, 90 percent of whom hold earned doctorates.

With distinct instructional programs (College of Arts and Sciences, School of Economics and Management, School of Engineering and Computer Science, School of Human and Educational Services, School of Nursing, Center for Health Sciences), the institution offers a diverse curriculum of general education and specific career fields. Virtually all courses are taught by faculty members, not teaching assistants.

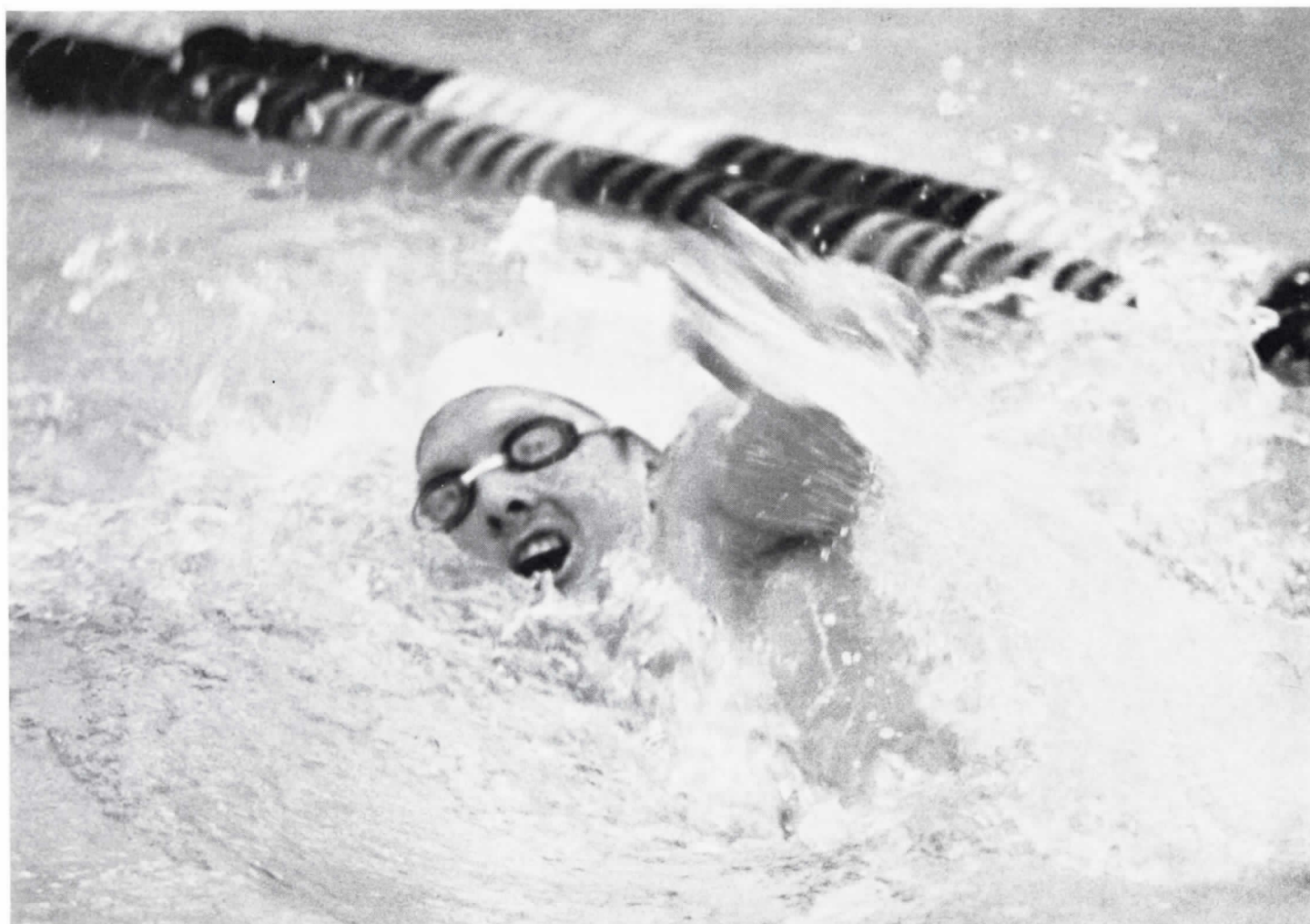
Academic support facilities include such notable entities as the Institute of Biological Sciences (which includes the V. Everett Kinsey Memorial Laboratory, the only major eye research center in the United States not connected with a medical school), the exercise physiology laboratory and the Center for Robotics and Advanced Automation. The Honors College was established to meet the educational needs of highly motivated students.
