# Master the possibilities

#### New purchasing card cuts paper work, adds convenience

The MasterCard Purchasing Card is now available for those using departmental petty cash, personal funds and small order purchase forms for university expenditures.

The cards reduce payment paper work and make smalldollar university purchases more convenient.

For each cardholder, the individual limit is \$400 per transaction. The monthly credit limit for each card will be determined based on departmental requirements.

Cardholders receive monthly purchasing card statements that they are responsible for reconciling. The cardholder's department retains the monthly statements and original charge receipts for seven years. However, no payment paperwork is required by the department. The Accounts Payable Office automatically pays monthly charges indicated on the consolidated statement from First Chicago/NBD. Each card is assigned an organization number to which payments are charged.

A training session for individuals involved in the university's payment process is scheduled for 8:30 a.m.-10:30 a.m. October 8, in Rooms 128-130 Oakland Center.

The session will cover basic document preparation and changes within the past year to policies for independent contractors and foreign travel. Space is limited, and reservations must be made by October 3.
