2nd Annual Medical Library Organ, Eye & Tissue Registration Drive

The Medical Library is proud to host our second annual organ, eye, and tissue donor registration drive as part of Michigan Libraries for Life, a partnership between **Gift of Life Michigan** and over 30 local health sciences, medical, public, academic, and hospital libraries across Michigan.

In our inaugural year, we registered 62 new donors and interacted with 339 total people in one day! This year by expanding the drive to three days, we aim to greatly surpass last year's totals!

The drive will be held October 8, 9, and 11 from 10:00 - 2:00pm each day in the Kresge Library Lobby. Registration is open to all so tell your family, friends, and colleagues they may register:
