OAKLAND UNIVERSITY



In 1957, the late Alfred G. and Matilda Wilson donated \$2 million and their 1,470-acre Meadow Brook estate to Michigan State University to establish a college in Oakland County.

Oakland University was founded in 1957 as a branch campus of MSU, with 570 first-year students. By the mid-1960s, it had evolved into a medium-sized university and in 1970 became an independent, state-assisted university. It now offers more than 70 undergraduate programs and more than 30 graduate programs and enrolls about 12,000 students.

OU's distinct instructional programs—the College of Arts and Sciences, School of Business Administration, School of Engineering and Computer Science, School of Health Sciences, School of Education and Human Services and School of Nursing—offers a diverse curricula of general education and career preparation courses. Virtually all of these courses are taught by faculty members, not teaching assistants.

The Honors College, a division of the College of Arts and Sciences, meets the educational needs of highly motivated students. The Division of Continuing Education meets the needs of nontraditional adult learners through evening and extension programs.

Academic support facilities include such notable entities as the Eye Research Institute, the only major eye research center in the United States not affiliated with a medical school; the Meadow Brook Health Enhancement Institute, which provides health maintenance/health improvement and cardiac rehabilitation community outreach programs; and the Center for Robotics and Advanced Automation, a unit of the School of Engineering and Computer Science that utilizes high technology manufacturing methods.

And OU's professional arts programs annually attract thousands to the campus. OU has received national recognition and local kudos for its Meadow Brook Theatre, Meadow Brook Art Gallery, Meadow Brook Hall and Meadow Brook Music Festival. OU is located 25 miles north of Detroit, near the small town of Rochester. OU's modern campus, which houses the university's many academic and public service programs, is located on a beautifully wooded site—much of it still undeveloped.



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SANDRA PACKARD
President



Sandra Packard became Oakland University's fourth President on June 15, 1992. Packard came to Oakland from the University of Tennessee-Chattanooga, where she was provost and vice chancellor for academic affairs and professor of curriculum and instruction. She held the position for seven years.

At UT-C, Packard was responsible for an annual budget of \$27 million. She initiated and raised funds to establish a \$3.5 million center for arts education. She co-raised funds for and established nine \$1 million endowed faculty chairs of excellence and established the College of Health and Human Services and the School of Social and Community Services. Under her direction, black faculty employment grew by more than 100 percent.

Packard received a Bachelor of Fine Arts degree from Syracuse University and master's and doctoral degrees in art education from Indiana University. She previously worked at Bowling Green State University and Miami University (Ohio).

PAUL HARTMAN
Athletic Director



Oakland University athletic director Paul Hartman is beginning his 10th year as head of Pioneer athletics. Hartman has taken four different athletic programs to new levels of success in an administrative career that has spanned four decades.

The OU athletic program has flourished under Hartman. Last year the women's swimming team won its third straight national championship, while the men's swimmers finished in the top three nationally for the seventh straight season. OU also had its soccer team earn an NCAA bid for the sixth consecutive year. In 1991-92 the Pioneers had their first-ever All-American in cross country. The 1989-90 season saw three winter teams place in the top four nationally, including the champion women's swimming unit. Those three, men's swimming, women's basketball, and the women's swimmers, won GLIAC titles, and were joined by the soccer team in post-season play. In 1988-89 Oakland equalled its best finish ever in the President's Cup, the all-sports trophy in the Great Lakes

Intercollegiate Athletic Conference. The Pioneers finished third in the Cup standings with just 10 league sports, and had the highest average of points per sport of any GLIAC school. OU won four GLIAC championships that year, and eight of the 10 league teams finished no lower than third. Men's and women's swimming won league titles and finished in the top three nationally. Women's basketball and women's volleyball also won league crowns, with the hoopsters advancing to the NCAA tournament. Soccer, Oakland's only non-GLIAC sport, was defeated in the national semi-finals.

Hartman has made a number of changes since arriving at OU. The department has brought back a Varsity "O" Club for former athletes, as well as the Oakland 100, a basketball support group. OU has also brought back baseball as a varsity sport, and made a number of improvements in the Lepley Sports Center, ranging from the refurbishing of the locker rooms and equipment area to renovation of offices and playing facilities. The department has also added the Pioneer Lounge, which is used for conferences and athletic receptions.

Previously Hartman had developed additional summer camp programs, created a new season ticket plan, instituted a Hall of Honor for exceptional Pioneer athletes, and introduced the first athletic team banquet.

The OU athletic director also made a large impact in his previous posts. At Plymouth State College in New Hampshire, his first post, Hartman started a football program with enthusiastic student support. Fifteen years later, a running back named Joe Dudek put that program on the map with a bid for the Heisman Trophy. In his second post, at Florida International University, Hartman began a women's golf program. One of the first women's scholarship award winners was Pat Bradley, who later became the first \$2 million winner on the Ladies' Pro Golf Association tour. Hartman did not begin the basketball program at his next stop, the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point, but one of his athletes there, Terry Porter, drew national attention as an NBA draftee from a non-scholarship school, and is now an outstanding point guard for the Portland Trailblazers.

A graduate of Ohio State University and a native of Columbus, Ohio, Hartman lives in Rochester with his wife, Jane. He is the third OU athletic director, succeeding Corey Van Fleet in June of 1983, who followed OU's founding father of athletics, Hollie Lepley.



MEET THE COACHES





BOB TAYLOR

Women's Basketball Coach

Take a good look at Bob Taylor's year-by-year record during his nine years of coaching. It's a career that spell's out success. Taylor has won 20 or more games seven straight years, including all six at Oakland, and has won two GLIAC titles and earned three NCAA Tournament trips, two of which came at OU. He is just nine wins away from 200 as he prepares for his 10th year as a college coach, one he is very excited about.

"I think we are deeper and shoot better than we have the last three years," Taylor said. "We also have more upper classmen than any year since we went to the final four (1990)."

The Pioneers placed second in the GLIAC for the second straight year in 1992. Prior to that OU won two straight GLIAC titles and earned a pair of NCAA Tournament bids. In 1990 Taylor won the GLIAC Coach of the Year award, as well as state women's basketball Coach of the Year laurels as selected by the Basketball Coaches Association of Michigan. OU's three tournament wins that year sent it to the final four for the first time since 1982, and it finished with a final record of 27-6 to go along with a 14-2 league record. Four years ago OU sprinted to the GLIAC championship with a 16-0 league mark. Its 26-4 record was the finest in school history and earned it the

first NCAA Tournament bid that since 1983.

The OU coach led his squad to a 21-7 record in his first season, 1986-87, an improvement of eight games over the previous year. The Pioneers also showed a seven game improvement in the GLIAC standings, rising from seventh to third with a record of 11-5. In 1988 OU ran up a 24-4 record for an .857 winning percentage, and tied for second place in the GLIAC at 13-3. OU is 139-38 in six years under Taylor, running his nine-year coaching mark to 191-70.

The 35-year-old Taylor was the head coach at Lake Superior State for three years prior to coming to OU, guiding the Lakers to a 52-32 mark. In 1985-86, LSSC was 24-5 overall, 14-2 and second behind Saginaw Valley in the GLIAC. Taylor's squad was the number one seeded team in the Great Lakes Region in the NCAA Division II Women's Basketball Tournament and finished the season as the seventh ranked team in the country. At LSSU Taylor took a program that had never finished higher than seventh in the GLIAC and guided it to 13-15 and 15-12 seasons in his first two years. In his nine years as a head coach Taylor has had just one sub-.500 season.

Taylor is a native of Sparta, Michigan and attended Sparta High School where he starred in both basketball and tennis. He earned two letters apiece in both sports at Grand Rapids Junior College and Arkansas Tech, where he also earned a bachelor of science degree in social science in 1980 and began his coaching career as an assistant coach. He then became the head coach at Boyne City High School, where he helped the Ramblers to a two-year mark of 37-10 and a spot in the Michigan Class C top ten.

Taylor, who has been involved in camps for both men and women, is co-director of the Michigan All-State Basketball Camp for girls held in Traverse City. The college division representative of the Basketball Coaches Association of Michigan is single and lives in Auburn Hills.

SUZY MERCHANT

Assistant Coach

When Bob Taylor started searching for an assistant coach, he wanted a person who was both familiar with, and well known in Michigan. He got both and a lot more when he hired Suzy Merchant to assist him with the OU women's basketball program.

The personable Merchant was a four-year starter and three-year captain at Central Michigan University. Merchant, an outstanding college point guard, is the school's game, season, and career assist leader. As a prepster Merchant was a Class A All-State choice in Michigan at Traverse City High School. Merchant is a veteran worker at camps throughout the Midwest, including the All-State Basketball Camp held in her hometown. Merchant was a volunteer assistant at CMU during the 1991-92 season, helping mainly with conditioning and pre-season work.

"Suzy is a great addition to our program," Taylor said. "She is a well known person in the state because of her personality, her ability as a player, and her camp background. Her personality will make her a very good recruiter, and her playing experience will make her a very good coach."

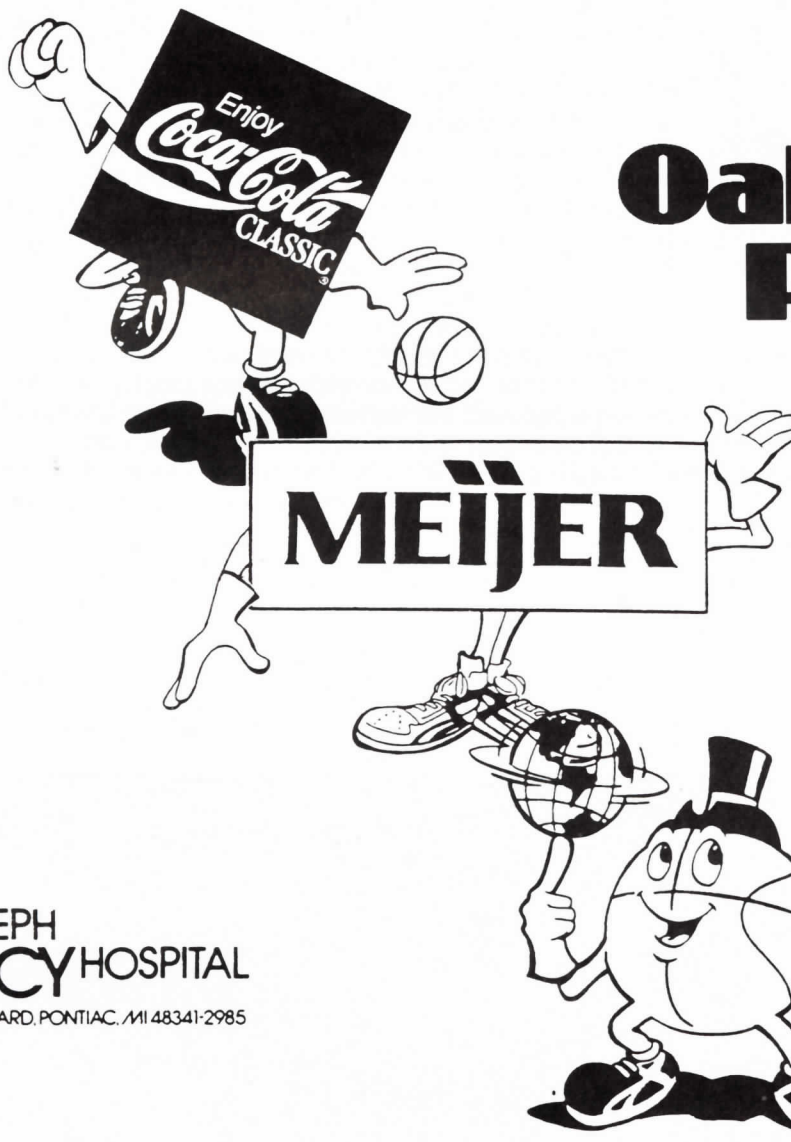
The 23-year-old Merchant earned a Bachelor of Applied Arts degree in Health Fitness from CMU in 1991. She is single and lives in Pontiac.

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MEET THE PIONEERS



PIONEERS ARE HOPING TO TRIPLE THEIR WAY BACK TO THE TOP

There's no denying the success the Oakland University women's basketball team has enjoyed under coach Bob Taylor. Six straight 20-win seasons and a pair of GLIAC titles would be at the top of anyone's wish list. Taylor and his Pioneers long for the days when they were the GLIAC kingpins, a lofty spot they haven't held since the 1990 NCAA final four season. This array of talent could be the group to bring the Pioneers back to GLIAC supremacy.

Taylor's plan is to run the break, shoot the triple, and shoot it fast. This year's OU team could go 10-deep, and almost all of them can fire it from long range.

"We will run as much as possible - off missed shots, steals, and turnovers," Taylor said. "We have a very good shooting team, better than the last three years. We will shoot a lot of three's and do it very quickly."

Senior Stacy Lamphere leads OU's three-point parade. The 5-11 forward was among the national top ten in three-pointers made all season long. She averaged 18 points overall, 17.6 in GLIAC play, and is poised to become Oakland's all-time leader in three-pointers made and attempted. The versatile scorer also has the ability to go inside, or face the basket and drive. Front court returnees Patty Robak and Leshia Sadler can also shoot the three, and both will challenge for starting spots. Robak, a 5-9 junior, started all 29 games last year and averaged 11.8 points per contest. She was second on the squad in triples made and is OU's number two returning scorer behind Lamphere. Sadler, also a junior at 5-11, led the team in overall three-point percentage and is the school's career leader in that category. Sadler averaged 6.6 points overall and is ready to take a bigger role this season.

Other returnees at forward include sophomores Kelli Krajniak and Trina Govan. The 5-8 Krajniak was OU's leader in assists last year, and is being moved up front. Govan, 5-11, could see increased time this season in the post. OU also has three newcomers who could make an impact up front. Tricia McMillen transferred to Oakland from Northern Arizona, and could move right into the starting line-up. McMillen is quick, solid defensively, and can score inside and out. Redshirt freshman Deanna Richard could see action at four different positions this year. She has the versatility to play all three front court spots and well as shooting guard. The only true freshman on this year's team is Kristen Francis, an All-State choice out of Harper Woods Regina High School. She rounds out an Oakland front court that is deep and talented.

Oakland has quality in the back court in senior Roni McGregory and juniors Doreen Belkowski and Angie Bond. McGregory was OU's starter at point guard the first half of last year. She averaged 5.4 points per contest and was second on the squad in assists. Belkowski and Bond are both combination guards, able to run the point and shoot extremely well. Belkowski averaged 8.2 points overall, 9.1 in GLIAC play, and was the league-leader in three-point percentage. Bond is a junior college transfer from Muskegon Community College, where she was a first-team All-American in 1992. Her addition makes the Pioneers' three-headed backcourt as solid as anyone's in the GLIAC. Both

Krajniak and Richard could swing back and see action at guard if needed.

The Pioneers will be tested with tournaments the first three weekends of the season, two of which will be at home. Among the opponents in those first three weekends are NAIA powers Central State and Indiana Tech. OU will also see league foe Lake Superior State, which beat the Pioneers twice last year, in two of those tournaments. The Pioneers also return to the Grand Rapids Press Tournament, which they have won five times in the last six years. Oakland will also host two teams which handed it losses last season in Mercyhurst and Slippery Rock, and again tackle 16 tough GLIAC games.

"We are obviously small so our lack of size will be a factor," Taylor said. "I think we will be able to score inside, but our ability to defend the post and defensive rebound will be a key. Defensively we will be a little more conservative. We will try to pester the ball instead of steal it."

OU's offense often stalled last year because of the lack of a serious inside threat. If that problem is solved this year there will be much less pressure on the three-point shooters. The Pioneers have the outside firepower, the versatility, and the depth to make a serious run back to the top of the GLIAC standings.

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Selected a third-team All-American last year by the American Women's Sports Federation...also selected All-Region, first-team All-GLIAC, and to the GLIAC All-Tournament team...led the Pioneers in scoring at 18 points per game...also averaged 5.9 boards and shot 47% from the floor, 42% from three-point range, and 82% from the foul line...led the Pioneers in scoring 19 times, including a career-high 28 in the GLIAC Tournament game against Lake Superior State...became OU's 10th career 1,000 point scorer in that game...among the Pioneer's career top ten in seven categories...led the GLIAC in three-pointers made per game (2.63) and was third in scoring (17.6) and three-point percentage (.438)...other honors included Grand Rapids Press Tournament MVP, All-Tournament Team laurels at the OU Tip-Off and Gus Macker Tournaments, and GLIAC Player of the Week...a Pioneer tri-captain this year... played in all 29 games as a sophomore, starting the last 12...averaged 11 points and 5.2 boards overall, 9.6 and 4.4 in GLIAC play...this three-point bomber was 3rd in the GLIAC in triples made per game...had a season-high 23 points against Heidleberg, one of two efforts of 20 points or more and 16 in double-figures...her other 20 point game was at Northern Michigan, when she scored 21, including a three-pointer at the buzzer to cap an OU comeback and send the game into overtime, a game eventually won by Oakland by a 98-90 count in two extra sessions...had a solid freshman season, averaging 5.2 points and 2.5 boards in 32 games...averaged just under 11 minutes per contest...shot 60% from the field...had a high of 16 points against Michigan-Dearborn...averaged 19 points and 12 boards as a senior at North Branch High School, earning All-State honors in Class B...a member of four prep league champion squads...her team was 24-1 during her senior year, losing only in the state quarter-finals...also earned All-Conference honors as a hurdler and placed fifth in the state in the long jump.

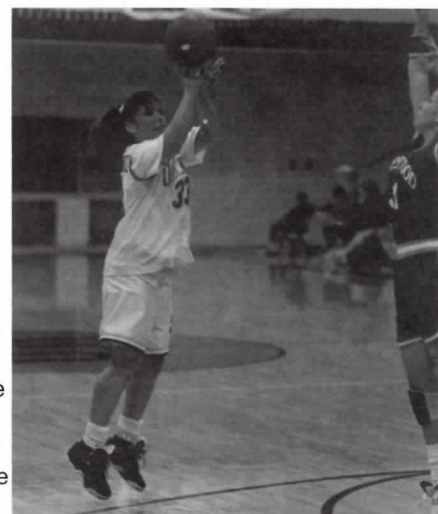

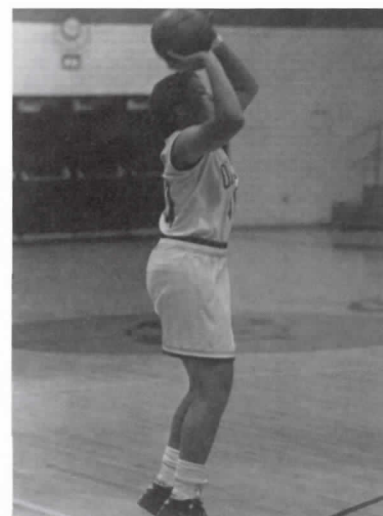

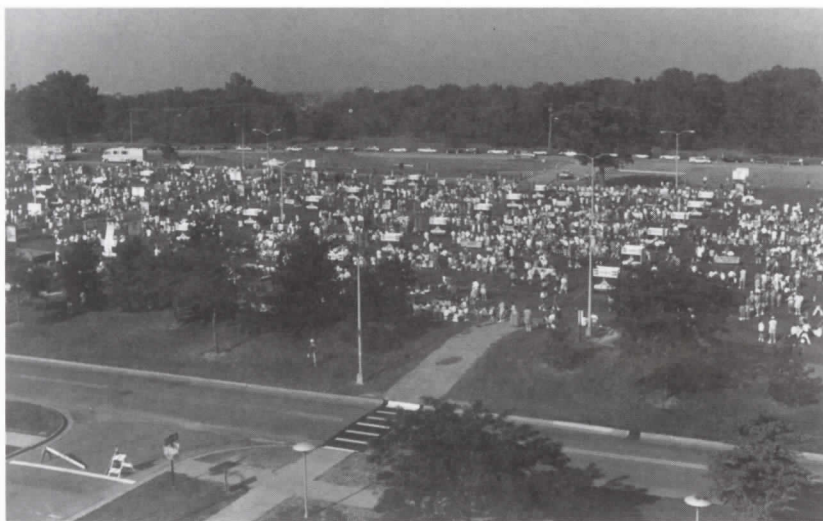
