OU hosts seminars on science vs. religion

Oakland University's **College of Arts and Sciences** is hosting a series of seminars throughout the fall that will focus on the controversies between science and religion. Each seminar is free and open to the public.

The first seminar, "Controversies between Science and Religion: Hope for Resolution," is Tuesday, September 18, from noon-1 p.m. in the **Oakland Center**.

During the seminar, a panel will discuss conflicts science and religion have had for hundreds of years, such as the conflict over evolution vs. creation. Controversial topics of today also will be discussed, such as the use of fetal stem cells in research, which is one of the hottest debates in the media right now.

Members of the panel include OU professors Paul Graves, Philosophy; Charles Mabee, Religious Studies; Sean Moran, History; and Michael Sevilla, Chemistry.
