PubMed Central Reaches 1 Billion Downloads in Record Time!




Resource of the Month: USMLE Easy

WHAT IS IT? A Q-bank that you can use to supplement the other study prep tools made available from the Academic Success Team in OUWB Student Services.

<u>USMLE Easy</u> covers the Step 1, Step 2 CK, and Step 3 exams with more than 11,000 practice questions for both basic science and organ systems. It allows you to take practice exams, view results immediately along with detailed explanations, create a detailed study plan, and track your performance overtime through a personalized dashboard. It also offers the opportunity to take a simulated 8-hour exam.

HOW DO I ACCESS IT? The link to USMLE Easy can be found on the library's <u>Databases</u> web page and on the <u>Review Resources Library Guide</u>.





WHY BOTHER? USMLE Easy has some nice features not seen in some of the other q-banks including:

- Each question is accompanied with a detailed explanation, USMLE blueprint correlations, associated topics, and a difficulty level.
- You will receive recommended readings based on your performance with links to specific chapters in texts in the AccessMedicine database. This provides context for your studying.
- You receive a peer comparison scores to let you know how you are progressing compared to other students nation-wide who are using the system.
- You can create customized quizzes for study during the organ system courses.

IS THERE AN APP FOR THAT? No, but the site is optimized to display well on mobile devices.

Please note that USMLE Easy is just one of review and test prep resources available from the OUWB Medical Library. Check out the other print and electronic resources listed on the Review Resources Library Guide including ExamMaster Online and the First Aid eBook collection.
