Authors at Oakland

The main work of the SLC is the annual Authors at Oakland event, which celebrates the scholarly output of the OU community, and the student recipients of the Frank Lepkowski Undergraduate Research in Writing Award. The 15th Annual Authors at Oakland: A Celebration of the Book solicited single submissions from the OU and OUWB communities, yielding a total of 75 submissions.

The Library Committee met three times during the 2019-2020 AY, and in two subcommittees actively participated in remote, online work between meetings in preparation for Authors at Oakland. Members:

- Reviewed and finalized letter to faculty soliciting their submissions;
- Updated criteria for submissions;
- Created, reviewed, and tested a form to gather submissions;
- Organized and curated submissions;
- Conferred and selected speakers and back-ups for the event.

Due to Covid-19 and the closure of campus, Authors at Oakland, scheduled for March 11, 2020, was canceled. Speakers, invited for the interest of their topics to a general, academic audience, were Danielle Ligocki on *The Drama of Reality Television: Lives of Youth in Liquid Modern Times*, and Graham Cassano and Jessica Payette on *Eleanor Smith's Hull House Songs: The Music of Protest and Hope in Jane Addams's Chicago*.

The Frank Lepkowski Undergraduate Research in Writing Award recognizes up to two students who have most successfully integrated library resources, discovered through their own research, in a course paper or project. The 2019-2020 first place recipient was junior Daniella Kenwell, and second place was senior Kari Strum.
