OU's Returning National Champions

OAKLAND UNIVERSITY

In 1957, the late Alfred G. and Matilda Wilson donated \$2 million and their 1,470-acre Meadow Brook estate to Michigan State University to establish a college in Oakland County.

Oakland University was founded in 1957 as a branch campus of MSU, with 570 first-year students. By the mid-1960's, it had evolved into a medium-sized university and in 1970 became an independent, state-assisted university. It now offers more than 70 undergraduate programs and more than 30 graduate programs and enrolls about 12,000 students.

OU's distinct instructional programs—the College of Arts and Sciences, School of Business Administration, School of Engineering and Computer Science, School of Health Sciences, School of Education and Human Services and School of Nursing—offers a diverse curricula of general education and career preparation courses. Virtually all of these courses are taught by faculty members, not teaching assistants.

The Honors College, a division of the College of Arts and Sciences, meets the educational needs of highly motivated students. The Division of Continuing Education meets the needs of nontraditional adult learners through evening and extension programs.

Academic support facilities include such notable entities as the Eye Research Institute, the only major eye research center in the United States not affiliated with a medical school; the Meadow Brook Health Enhancement Institute, which provides health maintenance/health improvement and cardiac rehabilitation community outreach programs; and the Center for Robotics and Advanced Automation, a unit of the School of Engineering and Computer Science that utilizes high technology manufacturing methods.

And OU's professional arts programs annually attract thousands to the campus. OU has received national recognition and local kudos for its Meadow Brook Theatre, Meadow Brook Art Gallery, Meadow Brook Hall and Meadow Brook Music Festival, the summer home of the Detroit Symphony Orchestra. OU is located 25 miles north of Detroit, near the small town of Rochester. OU's modern campus, which houses the university's many academic and public service programs, is located on a beautifully wooded site—much of it still undeveloped.

SANDRA PACKARD

President



Sandra Packard became Oakland University's fourth President on June 15, 1992. Packard came to Oakland from the University of Tennessee-Chattanooga, where she was provost and vice chancellor for academic affairs and professor of curriculum and instruction. She

held the position for seven years.

At UT-C, Packard was responsible for an annual budget of \$27 million. She initiated and raised funds to establish a \$3.5 million center for arts education. She co-raised funds for and established nine \$1 million endowed faculty chairs of excellence and established the College of Health and Human Services and the School of Social and Community Services. Under her direction, black faculty employment grew by more than 100 percent.

Packard received a Bachelor of Fine Arts degree from Syracuse University and master's and doctoral degrees in art education from Indiana University. She previously worked at Bowling Green State University and Miami University (Ohio).

Packard replaced John De Carlo, who served as interim president for one year after the resignation of Joseph Champagne.

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PAUL HARTMAN

Athletic Director



Oakland University athletic director Dr. Paul Hartman is beginning his 10th year as head of Pioneer athletics. Hartman has taken four different athletic programs to new levels of success in an administrative career that has spanned four decades.

The OU athletic program has flourished under Hartman. Last year the women's swimming team won its third straight national championship, while the men's swimmers finished in the top three nationally for the seventh straight season. OU also had its soccer team earn an NCAA bid for the sixth consecutive year. In 1991-92 the Pioneers had their first-ever All-American in cross country. The 1989-90 season saw three winter teams place in the top four nationally, including the champion women's swimming unit. Those three, men's swimming, women's basketball, and the women's swimmers, won GLIAC titles, and were joined by the soccer team in post-season play. In 1988-89 Oakland equalled its best finish ever in the President's Cup, the all-sports trophy in the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference. The Pioneers finished third in the Cup standings with just 10 league sports, and had the highest average of points per sport of any GLIAC school. OU won four GLIAC Championships that year, and eight of the 10 league teams finished no lower than third. Men's and women's swimming won league titles and finished in the top three nationally. Women's basketball and women's volleyball also won league crowns, with the hoopsters advancing to the NCAA tournament. Soccer, Oakland's only non-GLIAC sport, was defeated in the national semi-finals.

Hartman has made a number of changes since arriving at OU. The department has brought back a Varsity "O" Club for former athletes, as well as the Oakland 100, a basketball support group. OU has also brought back baseball as a varsity sport, and made a number of improvements in the Lepley Sports Center, ranging from the refurbishing of the locker rooms and equipment area to renovation of offices and playing facilities. The department has also added the Pioneer Lounge, which is used for conferences and athletic receptions.

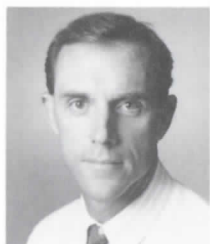
Previously Hartman had developed additional summer camp programs, created a new season ticket plan, instituted a Hall of Honor for exceptional Pioneer athletes, and introduced the first athletic team banquet.

The OU athletic director also made a large impact in his previous posts. At Plymouth State College in New Hampshire, his first post, Hartman started a football program with enthusiastic student support. Fifteen years later, a running back named Joe Dudek put that program on the map with a bid for the Heisman Trophy. In his second post, at Florida International University, Hartman began a women's golf program. One of the first women's scholarship award winners was Pat Bradley who later became the first \$2 million winner on the Ladies Pro Golf Association tour. Hartman did not begin the basketball program at his next stop, the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point, but one of his athletes there, Terry Porter, drew national attention as an NBA draftee from a non-scholarship school, and is now an outstanding point guard for the Portland Trailblazers.

A graduate of Ohio State University and a native of Columbus, Ohio, Hartman lives in Rochester with his wife, Jane. He is the third OU athletic director, succeeding Corey Van Fleet in June of 1983, who followed OU's founding father of athletics, Hollie Lepley.

PETE HOVLAND

Men's Swimming Coach



Oakland University men's swimming coach Pete Hovland is facing something this year that he has never faced before — a rebuilding year. The Pioneers suffered heavy losses last year and are a freshman-dominated squad. Just under half of OU's 23-man roster are spending their first year at OU.

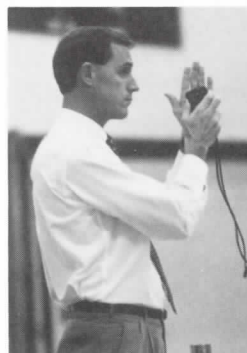
"We are very young from top to bottom in both age and experience," Hovland said. "We don't have a multiple champion type person to lead us like a McIlquham or Teal."

Despite falling short of a national championship, dynasty is still the proper description of the OU squad under Hovland. In 11 years as OU's men's swimming coach, Hovland's teams have finished in the top three in the country 10 times, with seven second place finishes, including five in a row from 1987-91. The success has become habitual for the man who has been selected NCAA Division II Coach of the Year three times.

Hovland has had the honor of coaching the NCAA Division II Swimmer of the Year in six of his 11 seasons. Senior Doug Allen captured the honor in 1991. Tracy Huth, OU's women's swimming coach, won the honor three times, while Mark VanderMey won it four years ago and Hilton Woods won it three years ago.

Hovland and Woods spent September of 1988 in Seoul, South Korea, as the two main ingredients of the Netherlands-Antilles Olympic swimming team, Hovland as coach and Woods as its top swimmer. Four years ago the pair was in Indianapolis as Woods captured a Bronze Medal in the 50-meter freestyle at the Pan American Games.

Hovland has posted a 88-34-1 dual meet mark in 11 seasons, including an 8-3 record last year. In addition, the Pioneers have won 11 straight GLIAC titles under Hovland, 15-in-a-row overall, and have been in the top three nationally for 14 of the last 15 years and in the top ten for the last 19 seasons.



Prior to being handed the head coaching reins, Hovland served as an assistant to OU head coach Ernie Maglischo for two seasons, one of which was OU's NCAA Championship year. The pair first hooked up at California State University at Chico, where Maglischo coached the 23-time All-American Hovland. While at California-Chico, Hovland won five individual national championships and was part of eight national championship relay squads. He was part of four NCAA Championship teams as a college swimmer. In 1977 he was selected as the Western Conference Swimmer of the Year.

Hovland earned his bachelor's degree in physical education at California-Chico in 1976, and received his master's degree from the University of Northern Iowa three years later. Hovland was an assistant coach at both Chico and Northern Iowa before joining the Pioneers. The 38-year-old Hovland is single and lives in Rochester Hills.

CHUCK MCCLUNE

Assistant Coach



Long-time swimming coach Chuck McClune is in his third year with the Oakland University men's swimming staff. McClune's main responsibility is with the Pioneers' middle-distance and distance freestylers.

A swimming coach in Michigan for 11 years, McClune made a name for himself in the state coaching Redford Catholic Central's boys team for four years and coaching the girls at Farmington Mercy for two seasons. During that time his teams went 49-7 in dual meets and won four of five possible Catholic League Championships. Mercy won its first-ever Oakland County title and improved from 21st to third in the state, while Catholic Central improved from 21st to eighth in the state. As a prep coach McClune coached five All-American relays and seven individual All-Americans. He was the Oakland County Girl's and Girl's All-Area Coach of the Year in 1989.

McClune is also a coach with the Oakland Live Y'ers program. His other coaching stints include four years at Farmington Harrison's girl's coach and 10 years as an assistant coach with the Michigan Stingrays. He has also been a fixture at the OU swimming camps for the last two years.

A graduate of Eastern Michigan University, the 35-year-old McClune is single and lives in Ann Arbor.

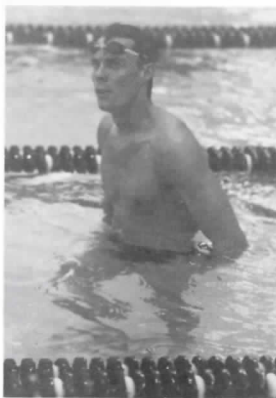
JON TEAL

Assistant Coach

Jon Teal, a 22-time All-American and nine-time national champion from 1989-92 at Oakland, joins Pete Hovland's staff this year as an assistant coach. Teal was the GLIAC Swimmer of the Year last year as a senior.

Teal was a seven-time All-American last year for the third straight season, and won his only individual title, capturing the national crown in the 100 free. His other titles came in the relay events. Two of those relays — the 200 free and 400 medley — hold NCAA Division II records.

A native of Milford, Teal is a graduate of Catholic Central High School, where he was a member of four Catholic League Championship teams. Teal, 22, is completing his degree in finance at OU.



NIKKI KELSEY

Diving Coach



Nikki Kelsey begins her first full season as Oakland University diving coach. The former OU diving All-American took over the Pioneer divers in mid-season last year. She promptly coached Marc Hairston to repeats of his one-meter national title and NCAA Division II Diver of the Year honors. On the women's side she helped Ingrid Bartnik to the three-meter national title and the runner-up spot on the one-meter board.

Kelsey was the NCAA Division II Women's Diver of the Year in both 1989 and 1990. She was the first two-time diving national champion in OU history, winning on the one-meter board in 1989 and capturing the three-meter event in 1990. She was a seven-time All-American and four-time GLIAC Champion during her career, and was named GLIAC Women's Swimming and Diving Athlete of the Year in 1990. She was a member of OU's first national championship team that year.

Kelsey is a native of Saginaw and a graduate of Eisenhower High School. She was the 1986 winner of the Hart Award, presented to the top prep women's swimmer or diver in the Saginaw area.



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REBUILDING, BUT STILL CONTENDING FOR HARDWARE

Oakland University's 1992-93 men's swimming and diving roster shows its youth. OU has just nine returnees from last year among its 22 swimmers and divers. The Pioneers have just six returning All-Americans from last year's squad, and only two of those are underclassmen. It adds up to a rebuilding year for OU, but with a consistently great program like this one, even rebuilding could mean an NCAA trophy.

"We hope to stay in the top three, but the top four is more realistic," coach Pete Hovland said. "We have enough quality and depth to continue our conference streak."

FREESTYLE: The Pioneers suffered great losses in freestyle, but have a great deal of depth this year, especially in the sprints. Senior Enos Pritchett is a three-year national qualifier and four-time All-American. He is joined by senior Jon Stump and junior Sean Peters, an All-American in the 50 free as a junior. OU added talent in its class of newcomers, led by sophomore Morgan Bailey. He along with freshmen Bryan Stafford and Chris Zoltak, could be national scorers in the sprints. Ken Tabacchi and Bob Holdridge will add depth

to the sprint squad. OU may struggle in the middle-distance events, where senior Carl Boyd will lead the pack in the 500. Other middle-distance freestylers are sophomore Jamie May and freshmen Tom Arnold and Craig Barney. Oakland may have its best group of milers in a number of years, led by senior Doug Allen. Sophomores Steve Traube and Eric

BUTTERFLY: Doug Allen, two-time national champion in the 200 fly, will lead this solid fly unit. The Pioneers depth in the fly hopefully will overcome the loss of one of the nation's best over the past four years, Eric McIlquham. Sophomores Steve Newton and Eric Traube hope to score in the fly this year. Among the newcomers, Chris Zoltak and David Dykstra are possible national qualifiers. Tom Arnold will also see action in the fly.

BACKSTROKE: Carl Boyd was Division II's best backstroker a year ago, and this year should be no different. Boyd won the national title in the 100 back and was second in the 200. Transfer Morgan Bailey is a former All-American in the backstroke and could score in both events this year. Chris Zoltak, a versatile freshman, is best in the back and could give OU a trio of scorers in these events. Freshmen Ken Tabacchi and Bill Wood could be future qualifiers.

BREASTSTROKE: Thirteen-time All-American Jeff Van Norman will lead the breaststroke unit. The senior, a five-time honoree a year ago, was OU's only scorer in the breaststroke last year. He will be joined by a pair of newcomers. Adric Arndt, a freshman, is a likely qualifier in the breaststroke events. Another freshman, Bob Holdridge will add depth to this small unit.

INDIVIDUAL MEDLEY: Oakland is extremely strong in the IM, with both quality and quantity. Doug Allen, a former champion in the 200 and 400, scored in both events last year. Fellow seniors Carl Boyd and Jeff Van Norman scored in the 400. Another returnee, Eric Newton, was GLIAC champ in the 400 a year ago. Four freshmen will also add to the IMers. Adric Arndt and David Dykstra could both qualify nationally in these events in their first year. In addition, Bob Holdridge will swim the 200 and Bill Wood will swim the 400.

DIVING: Two-time Diver of the Year Marc Hairston is gone, so Nikki Kelsey's diving unit will be all new from last year. Sophomore John Gottsacker returns after a year's absence and could emerge as a point-scorer on both boards this year. The Pioneers' young diving squad also features a pair of freshman with a ton of potential in Sam Castillo and Joe Rasette.

RELAYS: The loss of Eric McIlquham, Jeff Seifert, and Jon Teal may be felt the most in the

relays. Coach Hovland will have to use newcomers to replace these major relay contributors. The medley relays will be in good shape with the return of Carl Boyd and Jeff Van Norman. Likely replacements on the freestyle relays are Morgan Bailey, Chris Zoltak, and Bryan Stafford. Returnees Enos Pritchett, a relay veteran, and Sean Peters could have an increased role in the relays.

It says a lot for a program when you can have a rebuilding year and still contend for national honors. Hovland has a squad with solid seniors and a talented and exciting freshman class.

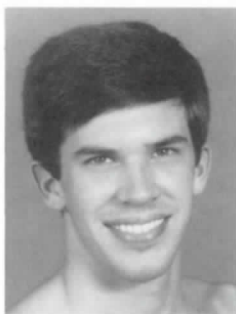
"We have a group that works hard and loves to come to the pool every day," Hovland said. "It's great to see such enthusiasm from this young squad."

A five-time All-American last year...repeated as national champion in the 200 IM...just the seventh individual in OU history to win back-to-back titles...other honors came in the 200 fly (5th), the 400 IM (5th), the 1,650 free (11th), and with the 800 free relay squad...selected as NCAA Division II Swimmer of the Year for his outstanding performance at the national championships as a sophomore...won national championships in the 200 fly, the 200 IM and the 400 IM...also earned All-America honors in the 1,650 free and with the 800 free relay squad...set school records in the 200 fly (1:49.52) and the 400 IM (3:59.42)...his 400 IM time was the first in school history under four minutes and broke a seven-year-old record previously held by Tracy Huth...also won GLIAC championships in the 200 fly and the 200 IM...a four-time All-American as a freshman...earned his national honors in the 200 butterfly (3rd), the 400 IM (5th), the 1,650 free (8th), and the 200 IM (9th)...selected GLIAC Swimmer of the Year...earned that honor by winning the GLIAC title in the 200 fly, the 200 and 400 IM, and with the 400 medley and 800 free relay squads...was an All-American swimmer at Interlake High School...a member of two state champion high school teams in Washington as a prepster...former YMCA national champ in the 400 IM.

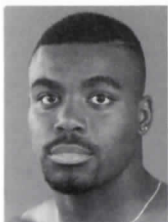


CARL BOYD

A seven-time All-American and three-time national champion last season...won the national title in the 100 backstroke, and with the 200 and 400 medley relay units...the 400 medley relay team set a meet record at 3:18.40...was second in the 200 back...other honors came in the 400 IM (7th), 500 free (10th), and with the 800 free relay team (3rd)...a 15-time All-American in all...Academic All-GLIAC choice last year...a five-time All-American as a soph...earned his honors in the 200 back (3rd), the 100 back (4th), the 400 IM (5th), the 1,650 free (13th), and with the 800 free relay unit...selected as GLIAC Swimmer of the Year...won GLIAC titles in the 200 back and 400 IM and with the 400 medley relay unit...was second in the 500 free...a three-time All-American as a freshman...was fifth in the 200 back, seventh in the 100 back, and 13th in the 1,650 free in 1990...just missed scoring in the 400 IM...was the state runner-up in Pennsylvania in the 100 while at Mt. 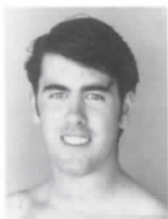

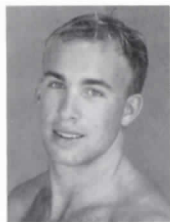

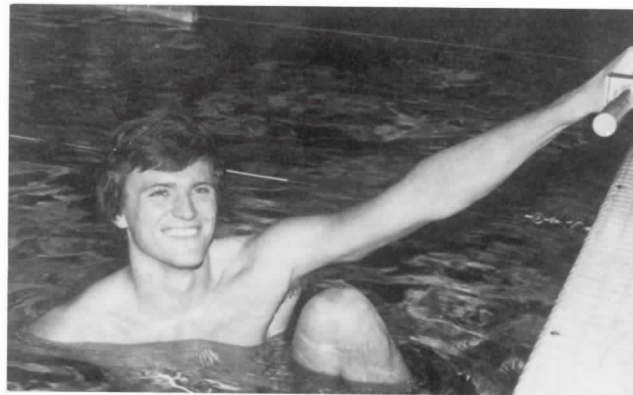
