VARNER TO TALK ON 'STATE OF THE UNIVERSITY'

Chancellor Varner will give a "State of the University" address at 2 p.m. Wednesday in the Sports and Recreation Building to launch the University's Tenth Anniversary program. The year-long observance will feature a study of problems facing higher education, including classes, seminars and conferences on the theme "The University in Crisis." Wednesday's special convocation -- which will not include an academic procession as originally planned--will be followed by the annual reception for faculty and AP staff members at the Varner home, at the corner of Butler and Adams Roads. All faculty and AP staffers are invited, whether they received printed invitations mailed out last week, or not. All members of the University community are urged to attend Wednesday's Tenth Anniversary Convocation.
