Processional:

- Sonata Pian'e forte - - - - *Giovanni Gabrieli* (1557-1612)

The music of Gabrieli was created to enhance the pomp and ceremony of Venetian life. St. Mark's cathedral, which was the center of Venetian musical activity, had two opposing choir lofts. This physical setting stimulated the development of the polychoral writing which became so characteristic of Venetian music. The *Sonata Pian'e forte* was composed in 1597 and is the earliest ensemble work to indicate dynamic contrasts of soft and loud. It is performed by two four-part brass choirs which are contrasted both in pitch and instrumentation.

Interludes:

- Gaudeamus igitur - - - - - *I. G. Gunther* (1717)

This famous selection is probably the oldest extant college song. The text is an adaptation of a twelfth century poem, and the music is from the eighteenth century. Growing out of the German university student singing societies, it also became the first college song in America when R. S. Willis brought it to Yale in 1840.

Sanctus from the Requiem Mass - Giuseppe Verdi (1813-1901)

This *Sanctus* comes at the climax of Verdi's *Requiem Mass*. Traditionally, the *Sanctus* of a mass contains fugal sections, but Verdi, imbued with Italian romantic fervor, scored the entire text as a monumental double fugue for two choirs and orchestra. Today the orchestral part is performed on the piano by Miss Bertha Seifert. The Oakland Chorus performed the entire *Requiem* with the South Oakland Symphony on April 7, 1964.

Henry Dixon Cowell (1897-)

The march is the sixth and final movement of Cowell's *Trio for Flute, Violin, and Harp*. This work was commissioned by the University for the First Symposium on the Arts, October 24-26, 1962, and received its world premiere at that time in the composer's presence. The present version for brass instruments was prepared by and is conducted by Professor David Di Chiera of the University Music Department.

Cowell is regarded by many as the dean of modern American composers. He was born in California in 1897, studied in this country and abroad and is at present a member of the National Academy of Arts and Sciences and of the faculty of Columbia University.
