# OU class taught in courtroom

Oakland County Circuit Court Judge Fred Mester is bringing a new type of experience to Oakland University political science students this semester. He’s teaching a class right in his courtroom.

PS 342 – “The Judicial Process” – introduces students to the judicial process in the United States and its relationship to the American political and social system. Special focus is placed on the federal courts, especially the United States Supreme Court. State and local courts also will be discussed.

The goal of the course is to give students a basic understanding of the operation of our courts and the impact of politics on our judicial system.

The class meets every Thursday from 6:30 to 9:50 p.m. in Courtroom 3B of the Oakland County Circuit Court in Pontiac.
