USMLE Easy An online test question bank covering content found in Step 1, 2, and 3. Create an account to save exams and track your progress. You may create customized exams on a specific discipline or organ system and choose between Practice Mode (not timed and ideal for studying), Exam Mode (timed), or USMLE Simulation to mimic taking the real exam. ExamMaster OnLine provides USMLE-style and medical subject review questions for Step 1, 2 and 3! Create your own quizzes and tests on specific disciplines or take a practice test which emulates the look and feel of the real thing! Unlike USMLE Easy, you may search for questions by keyword! *(Note: You must use your Oakland University email to register for ExamMaster OnLine).* Check out our complete [quick guide](#)!



Self-Assessment from the Lange Educational Library through AccessMedicine allows you to create custom exams from nearly 20 basic science textbooks, including neuroanatomy, physiology, anatomy, microbiology, and biochemistry. *(Note: you need to create a MyAccessMedicine account to create tests).*
