"The highly interactive multimedia lab – and the cutting-edge learning tools it provides – will allow nursing students to hone and perfect nursing skills through a myriad of hands-on learning opportunities."

Founders' Day is an opportunity to reflect with pride on Oakland's rich history, which began with the generosity of university benefactors Alfred and Matilda Dodge Wilson.
