From Reading and Language Arts Professor and Chair John McEneaney:

The Department of Reading and Language Arts is very pleased to announce that Gwendolyn Thompson McMillon, associate professor of literacy in the department of Reading and Language Arts, has been promoted to full professor by the Oakland University Board of Trustees.

Dr. McMillon began her career at Oakland University in 2001. Her research examines the literacy experiences of African American students at school and in out-of-school learning environments. Her work focuses on ways to improve teaching and learning, increase successful border crossing between environments, and improve home-school-community connections. She is currently project director for *Raising a Standard of Excellence in Our Community Summer Program* (a 3-year, church-community center collaboration in Saginaw), and is working with the public libraries of Saginaw on the "1000 books before Kindergarten" early childhood initiative.

Dr. McMillon serves as the faculty advisor for the newly chartered Oakland University chapter of Kappa Delta PI International Honor Society in Education, and has played a significant role in revising the SEHS Personnel Review Statement as a member of the Committee on Appointment and Promotion. Dr. McMillon was also recently re-appointed treasurer of the Literacy Research Association, where she also serves on the Research Committee and the Conference Planning Committee. She is a member of Saginaw Public Schools Foundation Board, editorial review board for several journals, and serves in many church-related leadership capacities, recently receiving the 2016 "Faithful Steward" award from the Wolverine State Baptist Convention Women's Auxiliary for her advocacy for women and children.

We are very proud of Dr. McMillon's many accomplishments and are grateful for her willingness to step up in her new leadership role as a full professor in the School of Education and Human Services.

Grad Path Lean Workout Team Recognized by Oakland University


