Meadow Brook Hall hosts Friday Flicks

Meadow Brook Hall is hosting Friday Flicks in the Rock Garden every Friday at 9:30 p.m. during the months of June and July.

The first Friday Flicks is scheduled for Friday, June 7. The program will not be offered Friday, July 5, due to the holiday weekend.

Meadow Brook Hall is the fourth largest historic house museum in the United States. It is especially renowned for its superb craftsmanship, architectural detailing and grand scale. Built between 1926 and 1929, the 80,000-square-foot mansion is complete with collections of original art and furnishings. In 1957, Matilda and Alfred Wilson left their residence and its collection along with the estate's 1,500 acres and \$2 million to found Oakland University.

Listed on both the national and state registers of historic places, Meadow Brook Hall strives to preserve and interpret its architecture, landscape, and fine and decorative art so visitors may be entertained, educated and inspired by its history.
