The exhibit provides a fascinating historical look at how microorganisms have shaped the modern health and commercial industries:

"Over the past two centuries, scientists, in partnership with industry, have developed techniques using and modifying life forms like yeast, molds, and bacteria, to create a host of new therapies and produce better foods and beverages. The exhibition illustrates the history of this dynamic relationship among microbes, medicine, technology, and industry, which has spanned centuries."

New Breast Cancer Screening Guidelines - The US Preventative Services Task Force (USPSTF) has released new standards for when and how often women should be screened for breast cancer. The guidelines state women ages 40 - 49 should have the choice to be screened or not and women 50 - 74 should be screened every other year. New Dietary Guidelines Emphasizing Healthy Eating to Reduce Chronic Disease - The US Departments of Health and Human Services (HHS) and the Department of Agriculture (USDA) released *The 2015 - 2020 Dietary Guidelines for Americans* in January 2016. The guidelines recommend forming lifelong healthy eating patterns, reducing daily sugar intake, and consuming a balanced diet of vegetables, fruits, grains, dairy, protein, and oils. 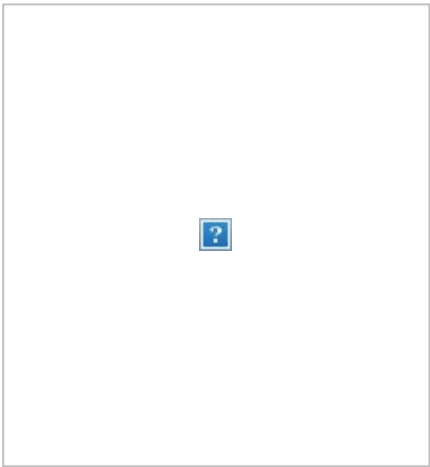
