OU offering course in Watershed Education

Oakland University's **School of Education and Human Services (SEHS)**, in conjunction with the Clinton River Watershed Council, is offering "Issues in Watershed Education," a three-credit graduate class beginning September 10. The deadline for registration is September 7.

Watershed education includes training in chemical and biological water monitoring techniques. This class is designed to empower teachers, or anyone interested in the Clinton River Watershed, to examine a wide range of watershed issues through hands-on activities and field studies. The course is being held at the Macomb Intermediate School District Office and various Clinton River locations.

Brett Levin, MS, community education coordinator for the Clinton River Watershed Council, will teach the course. He has 20 years experience in watershed education. His background in aquatic resources includes teaching natural resource education, developing angler education curricula, and developing an aquatic education program for the Boy Scouts of America.
