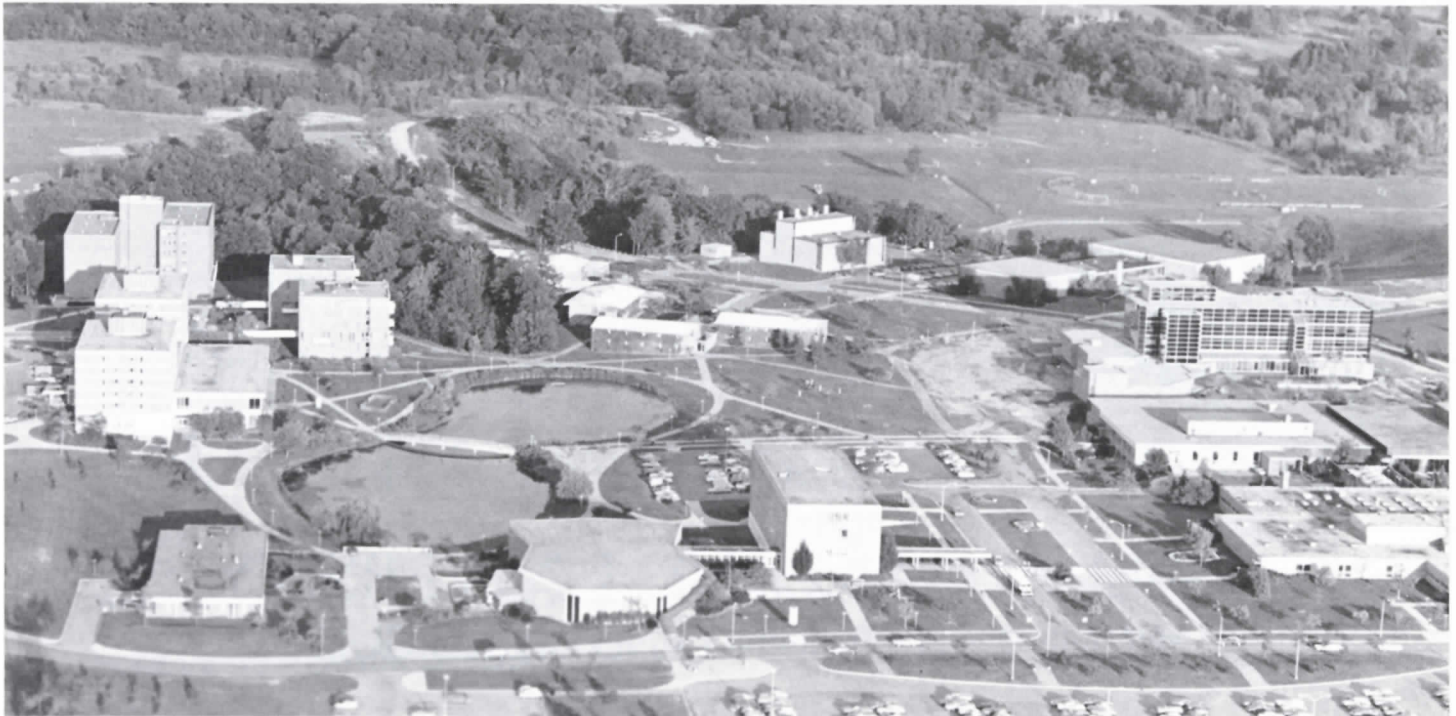

OAKLAND UNIVERSITY



In 1957, the late Alfred G. and Matilda Wilson donated \$2 million and their 1,470-acre Meadow Brook estate to Michigan State University to establish a college in Oakland County.

Oakland University was founded in 1957 as a branch campus of MSU, with 570 first-year students. By the mid-1960s, it had evolved into a medium-sized university and in 1970 became an independent, state-assisted university. It now offers more than 70 undergraduate programs and more than 30 graduate programs and enrolls about 12,000 students.

OU's distinct instructional programs—the College of Arts and Sciences, School of Business Administration, School of Engineering and Computer Science, School of Health Sciences, School of Education and Human Services and School of Nursing—offers a diverse curricula of general education and career preparation courses. Virtually all of these courses are taught by faculty members, not teaching assistants.

The Honors College, a division of the College of Arts and Sciences, meets the educational needs of highly motivated students. The Division of Continuing Education meets the needs of nontraditional adult learners through evening and extension programs.

Academic support facilities include such notable entities as the Eye Research Institute, the only major eye research center in the United States not affiliated with a medical school; the Meadow Brook Health Enhancement Institute, which provides health maintenance/health improvement and cardiac rehabilitation community outreach programs; and the Center for Robotics and Advanced Automation, a unit of the School of Engineering and Computer Science that utilizes high technology manufacturing methods.

And OU's professional arts programs annually attract thousands to the campus. OU has received national recognition and local kudos for its Meadow Brook Theatre, Meadow Brook Art Gallery, Meadow Brook Hall and Meadow Brook Music Festival. OU is located 25 miles north of Detroit, near the small town of Rochester. OU's modern campus, which houses the university's many academic and public service programs, is located on a beautifully wooded site—much of it still undeveloped.



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SANDRA PACKARD

President



Sandra Packard became Oakland University's fourth President on June 15, 1992. Packard came to Oakland from the University of Tennessee-Chattanooga, where she was provost and vice chancellor for academic affairs and professor of curriculum and instruction. She held the position for seven years.

At UT-C, Packard was responsible for an annual budget of \$27 million. She initiated and raised funds to establish a \$3.5 million center for arts education. She co-raised funds for and established nine \$1 million endowed faculty chairs of excellence and established the College of Health and Human Services and the School of Social and Community Services. Under her direction, black faculty employment grew by more than 100 percent.

Packard received a Bachelor of Fine Arts degree from Syracuse University and master's and doctoral degrees in art education from Indiana University. She previously worked at Bowling Green State University and Miami University (Ohio).

PAUL HARTMAN

Athletic Director



Oakland University athletic director Paul Hartman is beginning his 10th year as head of Pioneer athletics. Hartman has taken four different athletic programs to new levels of success in an administrative career that has spanned four decades.

The OU athletic program has flourished under Hartman. Last year the women's swimming team won its third straight national championship, while the men's swimmers finished in the top three nationally for the seventh straight season. OU also had its soccer team earn an NCAA bid for the sixth consecutive year. In 1991-92 the Pioneers had their first-ever All-American in cross country. The 1989-90 season saw three winter teams place in the top four nationally, including the champion women's swimming unit. Those three, men's swimming, women's basketball, and the women's swimmers, won GLIAC titles, and were joined by the soccer team in post-season play. In 1988-89 Oakland equalled its best finish ever in the President's Cup, the all-sports trophy in the Great Lakes

Intercollegiate Athletic Conference. The Pioneers finished third in the Cup standings with just 10 league sports, and had the highest average of points per sport of any GLIAC school. OU won four GLIAC championships that year, and eight of the 10 league teams finished no lower than third. Men's and women's swimming won league titles and finished in the top three nationally. Women's basketball and women's volleyball also won league crowns, with the hoopsters advancing to the NCAA tournament. Soccer, Oakland's only non-GLIAC sport, was defeated in the national semi-finals.

Hartman has made a number of changes since arriving at OU. The department has brought back a Varsity "O" Club for former athletes, as well as the Oakland 100, a basketball support group. OU has also brought back baseball as a varsity sport, and made a number of improvements in the Lepley Sports Center, ranging from the refurbishing of the locker rooms and equipment area to renovation of offices and playing facilities. The department has also added the Pioneer Lounge, which is used for conferences and athletic receptions.

Previously Hartman had developed additional summer camp programs, created a new season ticket plan, instituted a Hall of Honor for exceptional Pioneer athletes, and introduced the first athletic team banquet.

The OU athletic director also made a large impact in his previous posts. At Plymouth State College in New Hampshire, his first post, Hartman started a football program with enthusiastic student support. Fifteen years later, a running back named Joe Dudek put that program on the map with a bid for the Heisman Trophy. In his second post, at Florida International University, Hartman began a women's golf program. One of the first women's scholarship award winners was Pat Bradley, who later became the first \$2 million winner on the Ladies' Pro Golf Association tour. Hartman did not begin the basketball program at his next stop, the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point, but one of his athletes there, Terry Porter, drew national attention as an NBA draftee from a non-scholarship school, and is now an outstanding point guard for the Portland Trailblazers.

A graduate of Ohio State University and a native of Columbus, Ohio, Hartman lives in Rochester with his wife, Jane. He is the third OU athletic director, succeeding Corey Van Fleet in June of 1983, who followed OU's founding father of athletics, Hollie Lepley.



TRACY HUTH

Women's Swimming Coach

The first championship, 1990 in Buffalo, New York, was a shocker, a last-event victory that stunned the swimming world. Number two, 1991 in Brown Deer, Wisconsin, was a start-to-finish blowout. Last year the Pioneers went to Grand Forks, North Dakota as the underdogs, and controlled the meet from the first event to complete the sweet three-peat. Coach Tracy Huth won his third national title and second national Coach of the Year honor in just five seasons.

"We had so many questions and problems last year," Huth said. "When we lost to Northern Michigan in the GLIAC meet everyone wanted to know what was wrong. Our women believed in what we were doing. I have never been associated with such a total team effort."

Success has come very quickly for coach Huth. Individual national champion and Division II Men's Swimmer of the Year for the first of three times before his 21st birthday. Head women's swimming coach at OU by the age of 26, and coach of a national championship team for the first time in just his third season, an accomplishment that earned him his first honor as Division II Women's Swimming Coach of the Year in 1990.

The Pioneers returned to the top ten in Huth's first year, placing sixth nationally. Three years ago OU had 10 swimmers win a total of 41 All-America honors enroute to a third place finish. The 1990 numbers increased to 11 swimmers and 41 All-America finishes in bringing home the team crown. In 1991 18 swimmers, 14 of them underclassmen, won a whopping 68 All-America honors. Last season's title saw 14 swimmers and divers capture 63 national honors. The Pioneers also captured the first three GLIAC women's swimming titles, outswimming national power Northern Michigan University. The 1991 championship was won in OU's own home pool, while last year NMU broke the Pioneers' GLIAC string in its Marquette water.

Huth's three NCAA Division II Swimmer of the Year awards came in his sophomore, junior, and senior years. He was a rare 24-time All-American while at OU, and also claimed 12 national championships. Huth dominated the individual medley events from 1981-84, winning national titles all four years in both the 200 and 400 IM. His other four championships came as part of relay units. In his four years, Huth was instrumental in four top three finishes, including three second place endings. His OU heroics earned him a spot in the Pioneer Hall of Honor in his first year of eligibility.

The 31-year-old Huth and his wife, Renea, live in Davisburg with their daughter, Kara.





JEFF COOPER
Assistant Coach

Jeff Cooper is back for the second year of his second stint as an OU assistant coach. Cooper's first two years at OU included the first national championship year in 1990. Cooper spent the 1990-91 season as an assistant coach at Louisiana State University.

Cooper was a 13-time All-American in his four years at Oakland. Included in his national honors were top 12 finishes in his specialty, the 400 yard individual medley, all four years as a Pioneer swimmer. Cooper also earned All-America honors in the 500 and 1,650 freestyle and with the 400 and 800 free relay units.

Cooper was also a dominant swimmer in the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference championship meet, winning 11 GLIAC championships. He won four titles apiece as a freshman and junior, and was selected the GLIAC Swimmer of the Year in his freshman year.

An OU team captain, Cooper helped lead the Pioneers to four straight GLIAC championships and four top six national team finishes, including back-to-back second place finishes in his junior and senior years.

Cooper was an outstanding high school swimmer at Swartz Creek High School. The 200 and 500 free state finalist was Swartz Creek's Swimmer of the Year in 1984, and was an All-League performer and state qualifier in golf as well.



NIKKI KELSEY
Diving Coach

Nikki Kelsey begins her first full season as Oakland University diving coach. The former OU diving All-American took over the Pioneer divers in mid-season last year. She promptly coached Marc Hairston to repeats of his one-meter national title and NCAA Division II Diver of the Year honors. On the women's side she helped Ingrid Bartnik to the three-meter national title and the runner-up spot on the one-meter board.

Kelsey was the NCAA Division II Women's Diver of the Year in both 1989 and 1990. She was the first two-time diving national champion in OU history, winning on the one-meter board in 1989 and capturing the three-meter event in 1990. She was a seven-time All-American and four-time GLIAC Champion during her career, and was named GLIAC Women's Swimming and Diving Athlete of the Year in 1990. She was a member of OU's first national championship team that year.

Kelsey is a native of Saginaw and a graduate of Eisenhower High School. She was the 1986 winner of the Hart Award, presented to the top prep women's swimmer or diver in the Saginaw area.



HUTH'S PIONEERS SEARCHING FOR UNCHARTED WATERS



Sophomore Jodi Parker was a seven-time All-American last year.

No team in NCAA Division II women's swimming history has won as many as four straight championships. That just happens to be the number the Oakland University women's swimmers will go for this year. The Pioneers won their third straight title last season, and will go for number four in Canton, Ohio in March. Only OU and California State University at Northridge, now in Division I, have won as many as three straight. The Pioneers will have to make up for a large loss of points in freestyle and a major void on the relay teams to hold off contenders Florida Atlantic and Northern Michigan.

FREESTYLE: The Pioneers will have to make up for the loss of Lyn Schermer and Kerry Leavoy, who combined for 50 All-America honors in their four-year careers. The cupboard is far from bare, with the return of seniors Laura Fischer and Shannon Taylor, junior Angie Johnson, and sophomore Jodi Parker. Fischer posted top eight finishes in the 50 and 100 free and also scored in the 200. Taylor was OU's top distance freestyler a year ago, finishing second nationally in the 500 free and third in the 1,650 free. Johnson scored in both the 50 and 100 free, while Parker was a seven-time All-American as a freshman. She finished in the top eight in the 50, 100, and 200. Senior Monika Bunting, junior Cheri Vincent and sophomore Tracy Bruins are also back and looking to crack national cuts for the first time. Huth did add help in the freestyle events with his four newcomers. Debby Nickels will join Taylor in the distance events and give OU a solid duo. Kristen Nagelkirk and Ellen Lessig should give immediate help in the sprint and middle distance events. Ellen Surowiec, sister of co-captain Beth Surowiec, will add depth to the freestyle unit.

BUTTERFLY: The Pioneers are still in search of a full-time butterflyer. Last year's top flier was the graduated Katie Ill. The only scorers returning from last year are Shannon Taylor, a freestyler who scored in the 200, and Amy Comerford, a backstroker who tallied points in the 100. This looks to be the weakest of OU's strokes.

BACKSTROKE: When you have the NCAA Division II Swimmer of the Year and the meet record holder in the 100 back, you're automatically in good shape. Amy Comerford leads a talented backstroke unit and could win both events this year. Beth Surowiec scored in both backstroke events as well last year. Jodi Parker earned national honors in the 100 and is getting better and better. Junior Cheri Vincent and freshman Ellen Surowiec will also contribute to the backstrokers.

BREASTSTROKE: All-Americans Cindi Parker and Kathy Van Houten have graduated, leaving Oakland with just a pair of returning point-scorers. One of those is sophomore Danni Lentine, an emerging star who was fourth in the 200 last year. Angie Johnson earned national honors in the 100 last year.

INDIVIDUAL MEDLEY: Oakland is deep in the individual medley despite the loss of Schermer, OU's best IMer for four years. Amy Comerford and Beth Surowiec scored in the 200 last year, while Danni Lentine placed in the 400. Angie Johnson and Jodi Parker could also contribute in the IM events. Other help could come from junior Cheri Vincent and freshman Debby Nickels.

DIVING: Three-meter national champion Ingrid Bartnik has departed, so Nikki Kelsey, in her first full year as diving coach, has primarily a freshman squad. Senior Dawn Thomas, with limited experience, is the only returnee. The three frosh, Molly Cliffl, Becki Bach, and Angela Puchalsky, all are potential qualifiers. Cliffl is a likely scorer as a freshman.

RELAYS: The loss of Schermer and Leavoy will have a large impact on the relay units. Huth must replace those two on the 200 and 400 free relay squads. Amy Comerford, Laura Fischer and Jodi Parker will be the relay mainstays. Danni Lentine will swim the breaststroke on the medley relays, but the butterfly spot is up in the air. OU took three firsts and two seconds in the relays last year. A repeat would be a great accomplishment for the Pioneers.

If Oakland is to win its fourth title, it looks as though it will be tougher than the past two years when OU won wire-to-wire. The talent is there, and so is the depth. Division II's top swimmer, Amy Comerford, is also there. If it all falls into place, next year coach Huth's squad could be looking for one for the thumb.

NCAA Division II Women's Swimmer of the Year as a sophomore last season...a seven-time All-American and three-time national champion...won the title in the 100 yard backstroke in a school and NCAA Division II record time of 55.49...other titles came with the 200 medley and 200 free relay teams...was second in the 200 back and third in the 200 IM and 100 fly...holder of four school records, including individually in the 100 back and 200 back (2:01.26)...also holds the pool records in the 100 back (57.70) and 200 back (2:06.05)...earned six All-America honors as a freshman...finished in the top eight individually in the 100 and 200 backstroke and in the top 16 in the 100 fly and 200 IM...won her other honors with the 200 and 400 medley relay units...an All-State swimmer at Fredricktown High School...also ran track and cross country as a prepster.

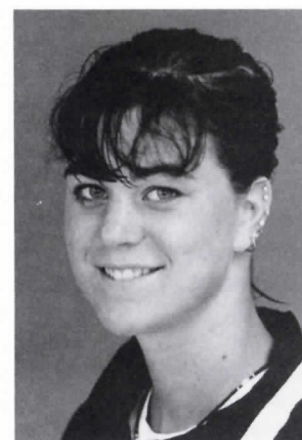

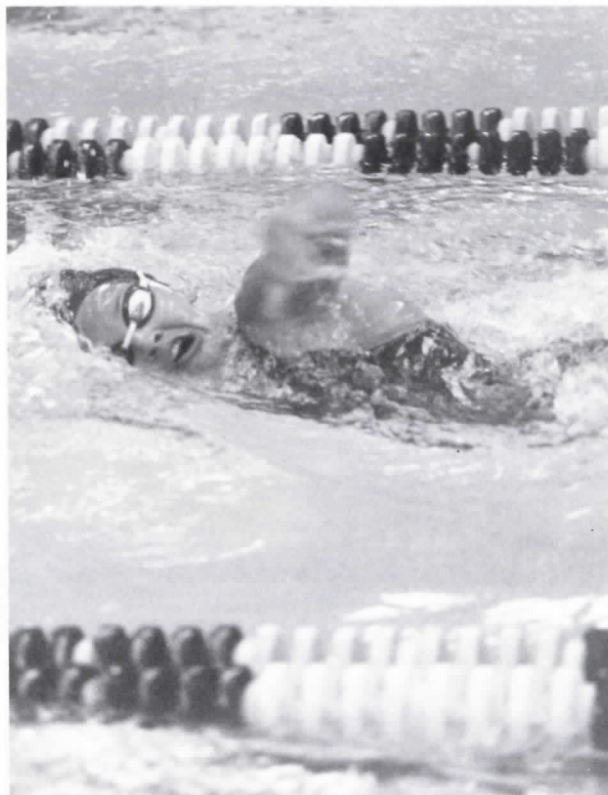
