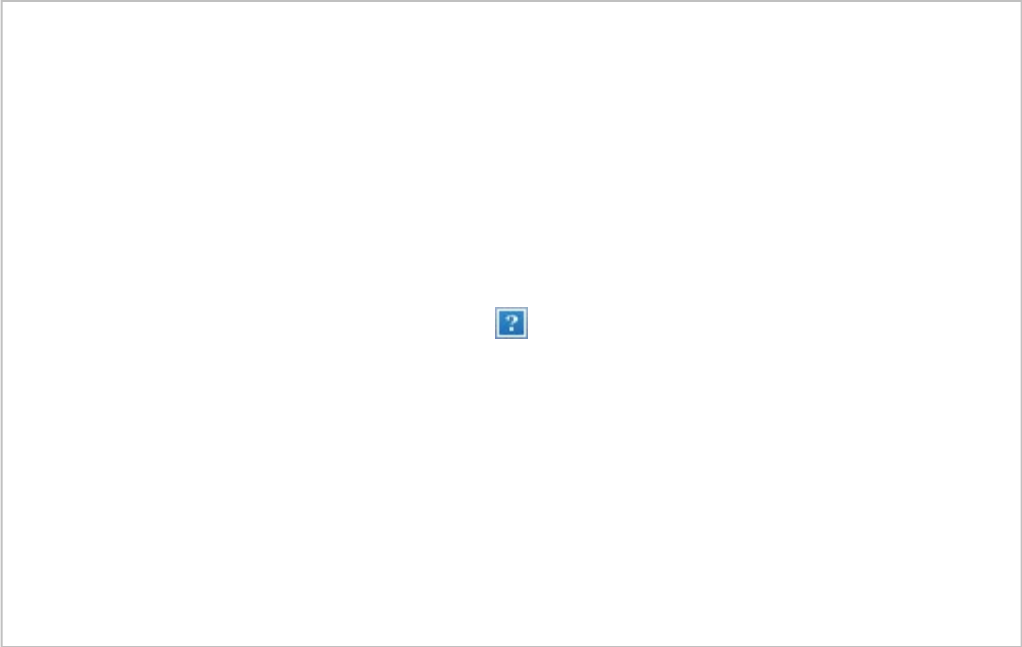

Resource of the Month: LWW Health Library - Clerkship/Clinical Rotations

WHAT IS IT? The [LWW Health Library – Clerkship/Clinical Rotations](#) database is an online resource specifically designed to support the six main clerkships – Family Medicine, Internal Medicine, OB/GYN, Pediatrics, Psychiatry, and Surgery. It contains key clinical resources for each clerkship – such as the [Washington Manual of Medical Therapeutics](#) for the Internal Medicine clerkship – along with review materials and case studies.

HOW DO I ACCESS IT? The link to the LWW Health Library – Clerkship/Clinical Rotations database can be found on the library's [Databases](#) web page. Individual textbooks are also linked on the [Course and Clerkship Guides](#).



WHY BOTHER? The materials in the database are selected specifically to support you in the clerkship environment. The “Self Assessment” section is particularly strong, with a new quizzing

feature that allows users to build custom quizzes, save and review results, and analyze areas of strength and weakness. Other reasons to use the database are:

- Clinically oriented books, handbooks, and review books that are continuously updated as new editions are published. See the full list [here](#)
- An extensive collection of cases for review. See the full list [here](#)
- Robust “Self Assessment” feature that allows you to track your study progress
- USMLE Step 2 and 3 review books
- The ability to download images to PowerPoint for use in non-commercial presentations and teaching

TIPS & TRICKS! You must register for a free personal account in order to use the self-assessment feature, print PDF book chapters, and download & save images.

IS THERE AN APP FOR THAT? No, but the site is optimized for mobile display on hand-held devices.
