SUBJECT: Allocation of Seats for the 1975-77 Senate

According to the Constitution, the makeup of the new Senate (after the addition of the School of Nursing) will be as follows.

8 Ex officio members (Provost, Deans of Library, Arts and Sciences, Engineering, Education, Economics and Management, Performing Arts, Nursing)
3 Presidential appointees
3 Students
2 APs
16 Subtotal
42 Elected faculty members
58 Total size of the Senate
Of the 42 elected seats, at least one must be allocated each to Performing Arts and to Nursing, according to the Constitution, leaving a balance of 40 seats to be allocated. Although the College of Arts and Sciences has 231 of 330 full-time members of organized faculties, it is limited to $49 \%$ of the 58 seats or a limit of 28 seats; one of the 28 seats is held by the Dean, so that Arts and Sciences receives 27 seats from the 40 to be allocated, leaving a total of 13 to be allocated.

The 13 seats are allocated to the faculties in proportion to their membership.
