Women's soccer team finishes record-breaking season

A successful season for the Oakland **women's soccer team** came to an end Nov. 14 as the team fell 1-0 to Michigan in the first round of the NCAA College Cup at Alumni Field in South Bend, Ind. The Golden Grizzlies created plenty of scoring chances throughout but were unable to convert as they close out the record-breaking season at 14-5-1.

"We are disappointed to be out of the tournament, but we didn't take care of chances, and Michigan worked hard to score its goal," said head coach Nick O' Shea.

The only goal of the game came from Michigan's Katie Kramer in the 63rd minute, her sixth goal of the season. Laura Tanchon sent a pass behind the Oakland defense that was collected by Kramer and shot under OU goalkeeper Sarah Buckland (Burlington, Ontario) who charged out to make the stop.

Buckland recorded five saves in her final college match, capping off a brilliant four-year career.

Michigan held a slight advantage in shots (15-14) as missed chances proved to be the difference for Oakland who defeated the Wolverines during the regular season.

This is the third straight year the Golden Grizzlies have quailed for the NCAA Division I Women's Soccer Tournament. Last year's team also lost to Michigan in the first round by a score of 1-0.
