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The athletic program strives for continued success in achieving its educational goal of providing total participation within a framework of excellence. Under the guidance of the Director of Athletics Corey Van Fleet, Oakland University's athletic department has 12 sports and offers cardio-vascular rehabilitation and physiology laboratory programs including prescriptive exercises and stress testing.

The Hollie Lepley Sports Center houses a range of facilities for individual and team activities including: a swimming pool; courts for handball, paddleball, badminton, squash, basketball and volleyball; a wrestling room; and an updated weight room. There is also an 18-hole golf course, eight excellent outdoor tennis courts and several well-groomed playing fields. These facilities combined with the university's beautiful wooded landscape and rolling fields make the Oakland campus one of the most ideal environments for sports activities.

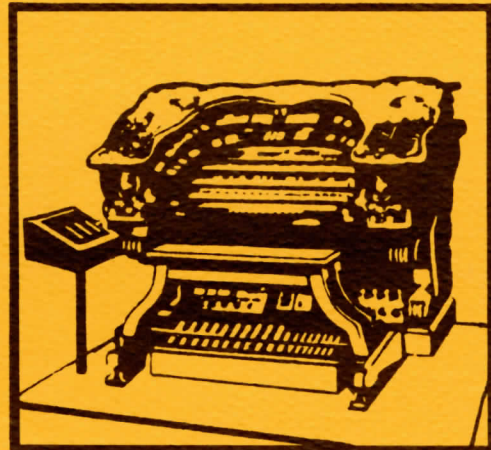

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# OU WOMEN'S BASKETBALL OUTLOOK

Last year, in his initial season with the Pioneers, Jones directed a talented group of freshmen and sophomores to a 20-9 record (OU's best ever), a second place finish in the Great Lakes Conference (GLIAC), and a runner-up performance in the State of Michigan AIAW Tournament.

In the 1981-82 conference race, Wayne State University should give the Pioneers the most trouble as they have for the past two seasons. OU finished second in the GLIAC behind Wayne State both in 1981 and in 1980.

This year, Jones has an abundance of skilled veterans and promising recruits to work with in an effort to capture the GLIAC title and earn a berth in NCAA post-season competition. (OU switched from the AIAW to the NCAA this past summer). Four of OU's all-time top ten leading scorers and rebounders will be in uniform this winter.

Leading the way for the Pioneers in 1981-82 will be All-American honorable mention forward Linda Krawford. The 5-11 junior scored 665 points as a sophomore to raise her career total to 1,082.

Vondrasek, a 1980-81 all-GLIAC choice, will be OU's other primary threat at the forward spot. The 5-10 junior is ranked fifth on the all-time scoring list with 630 points.

Three freshmen will also help out as forwards. They are 6-1 Brenda McLean (all-state honorable mention, Marysville), 5-11 Mary Beth Kossarek (fourth team all-state, Harper Woods Bishop Gallagher) and 5-8 Anya Williams (Detroit Henry Ford).

At center, Jones has experience in 6-0 junior Cordella Donner and height in 6-3 freshman Kim Nash (all-state honorable mention, Trenton).

5-7 junior Anne Kish and 5-5 junior Kelly Kenny are expected to anchor the backcourt with assistance from 5-8 sophomore Pam Springer, Williams, 5-5 freshman Gwen Browner (all-state honorable mention, Detroit Henry Ford), and freshman Pam Williams (Flint Northern).

## COACHING

### Head Coach Dewayne Jones

A Northern Michigan University Alum DeWayne Jones began his collegiate coaching career at Oakland University last year—directing the women's basketball team to a best ever 20-9 record.

Jones' first coaching job was with the girls' program at Ferndale H.S. 1976. In the two seasons with the team, he compiled a 36-6 record and captured a pair of conference and district titles.

Jones assumed the Ferndale boys' coaching position late in the 1977-78 season. The following season, the team went 11-10 and the year after went 20-4—capturing their first conference title in ten years and their first district championship in eight.

Jones was named *Royal Oak Tribune* 1980 Coach of the Year and *Detroit News* 1980 Metro North Coach of the Year.

The 28-year-old, his wife, and his three children live in Pontiac.

### Assistant Coach Pat Graves

Assistant coach Pat Graves began her collegiate coaching career with the Pioneers last year.

A 1974 Central Michigan University graduate, Graves coached at the junior varsity level at Capac High School from 1974-78. In those five seasons, her teams put together a 54-14 record, one undefeated campaign, and three league championships.

Graves earned her master's degree in guidance and counseling from OU in 1979, and teaches at Van Hoosen Junior High in Rochester where she lives.





# OU MEN'S BASKETBALL

## OUTLOOK

With only one player lost to graduation and another successful recruiting effort, 1981-82 appears even better in pre-season than did 1980-81. The Pioneers are cautiously optimistic—ever mindful of last year's misfortune.

Two of OU's all-time leading scorers and rebounders are expected to spark the Pioneers this season. They are 6-6 senior forward Bill Peterson (seventh all-time scorer, sixth all-time rebounder) and 6-5 senior forward Rich Brauer (11th all-time scorer, tenth all-time rebounder). Peterson, a 1980-81 all-GLIAC selection and two-time OU MVP, led the team in scoring last year with a 15.5 PPG average and ended up with an 8.5 RPG average. Brauer, an all-GLIAC choice in 1979-80, averaged 20.3 PPG and 10.0 RPG during the Pioneers' first four contests before being injured for the rest of the winter.

Five other veterans will bolster the front line—seniors Dennis Hammond (6-4, 11.5 PPG, 4.4 RPG) and Tom Blythe (6-7, 4.0 PPG, 3.6 RPG) and sophomores Larry Lubitz (6-7, 10.4 PPG, 6.2 RPG), Mike Mohn (6-8, 11.3 PPG, 7.3 RPG) and Rob Manilla (6-4, 5.8 PPG, 2.3 RPG).

The Pioneer backcourt will consist of six newcomers: 6-2 junior transfer Antoine Williams (Southeastern Community College-Iowa; all-state, Pontiac Central) and freshmen Craig Mitchell (6-0, all-league, Harper Woods Notre Dame), Brian Werner (6-4, Sterling Heights Stevenson), Craig Tonti (6-2, all-state, Cass City), Tom Loyd (6-2, Oakland County leading scorer 1980-81, Waterford Kettering) and Jerome Love (5-10, Detroit Osborne).

## COACHING

### Head Coach Lee Frederick

Entering his sixth year at Oakland University, Lee Frederick serves as the assistant director of athletics and men's head basketball coach after holding the women's tennis coaching position from 1977-79. As the women's tennis coach, he put together an impressive 49-19 record.

Since taking the basketball job in the middle of the 1978-79 season, Frederick has compiled a 39-55 mark. Before coming to OU, he was an assistant basketball coach at Northern Michigan University and Western Illinois University.

An all-state high school player in Illinois, Frederick went on to play for Bradley University and was a member of the 1964 National Invitational Tournament championship team.

While at Bradley, he earned both his bachelor's and master's degrees in psychology.

### Assistant Coach Steve Hebold

Like men's head coach Lee Frederick, assistant coach Steve Hebold has been with the Pioneers for over five years.

After graduating from Royal Oak Kimball High School (MI) in 1970, Hebold went to the University of North Dakota on a basketball scholarship. An all-state selection at Kimball, he received approximately 12 scholarship offers.

The director of OU's summer basketball camps for boys, Hebold also teaches at Birmingham Brother Rice High School. Before taking the assistant coaching position with the Pioneers, he held a similar post at Brother Rice.

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### The Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference

Since its beginning in 1971, the GLIAC has been rich in talented student-athletes that have reached outstanding levels of achievement. There were 61 All-American student-athletes among the eight conference schools last year. Oakland University paced the way with 15 All-American selections, including 14 men swimmers and 1 women's basketball player, Helen Shereda. Shereda and two other student-athletes were drafted into the professional ranks. Oakland University also won its first NCAA Division II Swimming and Diving Championship, with Mark Doyle, Mark Vagle and Ian Dittus winning individual national titles. Wayne State University won its second straight NCAA fencing crown. Michigan Tech joined the conference this year. The list of Conference achievements will continue to grow longer and stronger in the future.

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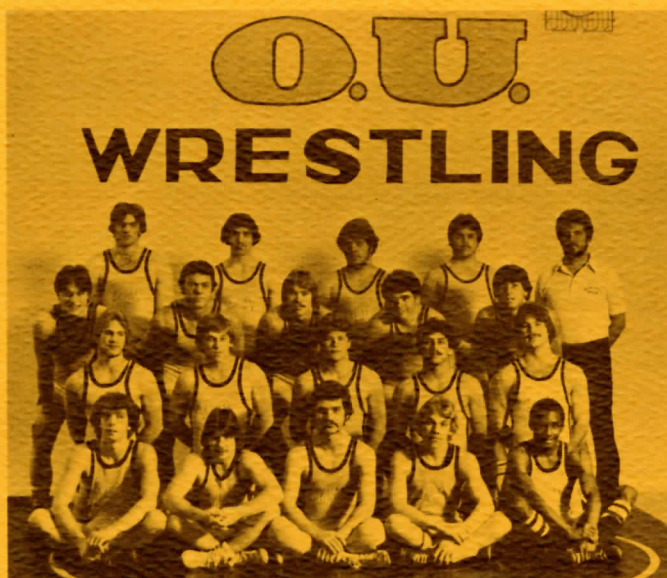
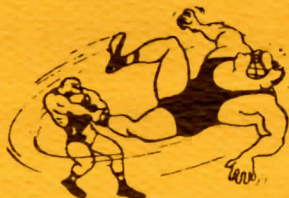


# OU WRESTLING

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# OU MEN'S SWIMMING

## COACHING



### Pete Hovland

Pete Hovland, the women's swimming head coach and men's assistant at Oakland University for the past two years, replaces Ernie Maglischo as the men's head coach in 1981-82. Maglischo stepped down from the position at the conclusion of the 1980-81 season after guiding the Pioneers to OU's first ever national championship (1980) and a national runner-up spot (1981) during his two year stay with the university.

Hovland swam on Maglischo's four NCAA Division II championship squads at California State University-Chico (1972-1976), and came east with him to OU in 1979 after earning his Bachelor of Arts (Chico State/1977) and Master of Arts (University of Northern Iowa/1979) degrees in physical education.

As a Chico State swimmer, Hovland won five individual national titles, participated in eight national title winning relays, and earned All-American status 23 times. All 13 titles were captured in record-breaking performances.

Hovland, a native of California, was named Chico State Senior Scholastic Athlete of the Year and Far Western Conference Scholastic Athlete of the Year in 1977, and Chico State Swimming Athlete of the Decade in 1979.

With several years of coaching experience at Chico State and Northern Iowa behind him, Hovland made his mark with the Pioneers as soon as he arrived on campus. His 1979-80 women's team placed third at the AIAW Midwest Regionals—up four places from the year before—and his 1980-81 squad won the meet outright.

"It's going to be hard to replace someone like Ernie, so I'd rather think of it not so much as replacing him, but rather just continuing where he left off."

"Oakland has a tradition of swimming excellence, and I hope I can help keep it at the level it is," Hovland said.

## OUTLOOK

The Oakland University men's swimming team has placed no lower than seventh in the NCAA Division II national meet over the last eight years. With national champions Tracy Huth (200 IM, 400 IM, 800 Free Relay), Mark Vagle (200 Free, 400 Free Relay), Darin Abbasse (400 Free Relay) and Gordon Geheb (400 Free Relay, 800 Free Relay) leading the way, 1982 should be another banner season for the Pioneers.

First year head coach Pete Hovland did lose six swimmers to graduation, however, the damage done by their loss will hopefully be lessened by the acquisition of freshmen standouts John Christianson and Mike Obenshain.

The OU diving corps should be strong this year with the return of B.J. Kearny and the addition of transfer Rusty Eubanks. While Kearny has been sidelined for two years with an injury after setting two school records, Eubanks finished 15th in the 1981 NCAA Division II meet for Central Missouri. Kearny will also be helping as coach for both the men and women divers.

# OU WOMEN'S SWIMMING

## OUTLOOK

The Pioneers will be coached by Mark Johnston. In his first year at OU after working as an assistant at the University of Michigan, Johnston takes over for Pete Hovland who will be the men's coach this season.

Sophomore sensation Karen Enneking and junior standout Tammy McGinnis will be the sparkplugs for the OU women as they head into their first season of competition as a NCAA Division II program. OU switched from the AIAW Division I to the NCAA this past summer.

Enneking shattered three individual school records (50, 100, 200 Breaststroke) and was a member of two record breaking relay teams (200, 400 Medley). She qualified for the AIAW Division I national meet and became the first women's swimmer at OU to earn All-American status.

McGinnis, the Pioneer's primary long distance threat, broke four individual school marks (22 IM, 500, 1,000, 1,650 Free) and joined Enneking in the record 200 and 400 Medley Relay events.

Sophomores Mary Vincent and Jeanne Brink will once again anchor the diving for OU. Vincent holds the three meter (six dives) school record.

### Mark Johnston

Although he says he "didn't expect to get this kind of coveted position," new OU women's swimming coach Mark Johnston has set some pretty lofty goals for the Pioneer "Swimmin' Women" in 1981-82.

Johnston, who replaces new men's head coach Pete Hovland at the helm of the women's program, hopes to develop a winning attitude with the women and build their confidence so they stand a better chance of defeating their opponents in national competition.

"I feel very confident that the team will be going to nationals this year," said Johnston. Part of that optimism stems from the fact that the OU women will be competing in the NCAA's Division II rather than the somewhat rougher waters of Division I, where they were last year when they were affiliated with the AIAW.

"I'm really excited about this year and about being at Oakland," said Johnston. "I know I can do the job, regardless of how many hours or how much energy it takes, because I simply won't lose."
