Career development facilitator training being offered

Oakland University's **School of Education and Human Services** will offer its Career Development Facilitator Training (CDF) program beginning Tuesday, Jan. 6. Classes will be held throughout the winter semester from 4:30 - 8 p.m. at Seaholm High School in Birmingham. Applications currently are being accepted.

CDF training is endorsed by the National Career Development Association, the National Employment Counseling Association and the National Association of Workforce Development Professionals. The 120-hour program is designed for individuals who work in the career development field including employment and displaced-worker services, human resource departments, vocational rehabilitation centers, schools and college career centers. In-depth coverage of employability skills, career and labor market information, cultural diversity and special populations, career center management and promotion, and ethical and legal issues will be covered.

The cost of the CDF certificate program is \$695. Participants may additionally elect to take the course for OU undergraduate or graduate credit.

Registration currently is open for the winter CDF program. The deadline is Monday, Dec. 15. Details are available on the **Department of Professional Development and Education Outreach** Web site.
