Welcome Week highlights student activities

New and returning Oakland University students can learn about many different university departments, services and student organizations during the seventh annual Welcome Week, which runs from Tuesday, September 4, through Saturday, September 8.

Welcome Week is filled with educational and social events for all students, said Jean Ann Miller, co-chair of the Welcome Week planning committee.

"Welcome Week is a great way to highlight all the resources on OU's campus," Miller said. "Academics are very important, but there's also a lot of social activities that happen on campus. This is a nice way for different departments and student organizations to provide a first glimpse of what campus life is like."

Among the new activities this year are a **Student Affairs** Scavenger Hunt, where students can win prizes for finding different university offices and services, and "Healthy Beginnings," a program sponsored by the **Graham Health Center** offering health and insurance information. One of the most popular events is **Sigma Pi** fraternity's Pig Roast, which has attracted up to 1,200 students in past years, Miller said. **New Student Convocation** is a traditional university event in which faculty and newly admitted students and their families are brought together for the first time.
