SDS---STUDENTS FOR DEMOCRATIC SOCIETY OR SILLY DAMN STUDENTS ?

Oakland's SDS chapter has, over the past couple years, made the usual noises about the need to decentralize the power structure of everything from Oakland University to the national government, and return a larger share of the decision making process to the individual. The Oakland SDS rank and file and organization alike has been most heated in its condemnation of the use of force by any established political or governmental organization to coerce individuals into maintaining order. The use of the police power, according to the SDS, is always wrong and in fact generally fascistic.

However, this week past our SDS showed that it considered it evil only for members of the political right to try to use coercion as a tool. In a typical example of left wing double think the SDS preceded, in its own inimitable half-baked way, to disrupt the operations of the visiting GIA recruiter. Their efforts towards this end were, fortunately, a flop. The attempt did, however, manage to show Oakland students what attitudes really lie beneath the verbiage of the SDS. For all their handwringing over the supposed usurpation of democratic rights by bureaucracy the SDS showed that it really feels that it should be the one to have the power to usurp others rights for some left wing goal. The SDS, by planning to make the operation of the recruiter impossible, cooly ignored the civil rights of those who wished to seek information about employment with the GIA. It was not because the SDS did not try to throughly disrupt the recruiters activities that the attempt failed. It was rather the fact that there were not snough left wing autocrats on campus to carry out the SDS program.

One might hope that the SDS would learn something from its last fiasco and in the future resort to more responsibly though less melodramatic means to place their case before the student body. This is, however, probably too much to hope for; for it would seem that our own student left has already developed the same attitudes towards the civil rights of those they consider to be politically pands unenlightened as the wretched little men who direct the fates of the unfortunate citizens of such states

as Noth Korea, Bast Germany and Cuba,
