From Director of Development Dave Tindall:

At this past Winter College in Florida, a phrase was coined by OU colleagues, New OU. As I think of it though, we are in a new phase of OU, so much is new and exciting. The New OU in my mind is the beginning of a wonderful adventure. We are at a place where students can meet at the tower and build memories, we all can Wear the Bear, and more importantly Aspire to Rise. This past Monday, the 2014-15 AUFD launched. President Hynd was the first donor this year, with fellow faculty and staff following, raising \$57,800 by day's end. A few new things I want to highlight about the AUFD:

- 1. Named scholarship: with a onetime gift of \$1,000, you can create a named scholarship. The gift can be from one or many individuals. The President's Office will match the scholarship (with 50¢ on the dollar) once \$1,000 is reached. Jim Hansen has Three Articles Published

James Hansen, professor in Counseling published three articles in nationally refereed journals in 2014. The first article, which is related to Hansen's interest in philosophical issues in counseling, is a theoretical model for bridging the gap between counseling theories and practice. He also published two articles on humanism, which is another one of his scholarly interests. The articles on humanism wove together philosophical, historical, and empirical themes to position humanistic ideology at the center of counseling practice.

In addition to these articles, Hansen has accepted an invitation to be the keynote speaker at the Association for Humanistic Counseling (AHC) annual national conference in June 2015. The title of his presentation is, *Humanistic Counselors: Cultivating Meaning in a Mindless Age.* The AHC is a division of the American Counseling Association.

Overview of Recent Activities Related to Autism Spectrum Disorder

On Tuesday, September 23, 2014, Janet Graetz, Kathy Sweeney, and Kristin Rohrbeck were invited to a Legislative Breakfast in Lansing that provided an opportunity for legislators and stakeholders in the community to celebrate the progress of the autism insurance reform bill and university projects that addressed the need for services and supports to individuals and families affected by autism.

Later that week, Janet Graetz and Jessica Korneder attended the Michigan Autism Conference sponsored by Western Michigan University, where they were both invited to be part of a luncheon for researchers and key university personnel.

On October 1, Janet returned to Lansing to meet with members of the Department of Community Health and other key university personnel to discuss how recently appointed funding will be used for this coming year. A portion of the funds will be used to establish a clinic in Pawley Hall that addresses services in Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) for young children with autism.
