	Self-Assessment from the Lange Educational Library through AccessMedicine allows you to create custom exams from nearly 20 basic science textbooks, including neuroanatomy, physiology, anatomy, microbiology, and biochemistry. <i>Note: you need to create a MyAccessMedicine account to create tests.</i>

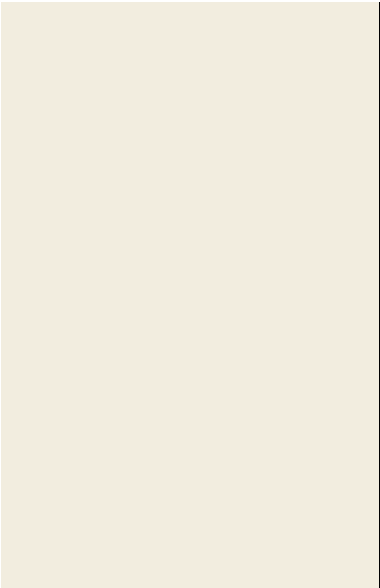

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New NLM Image Database: MedPix®

The National Library of Medicine recently launched **MedPix®**, a free online medical image database of images from nearly 120 patient cases. Currently, you can only **browse the cases**, but text searching and other functionality will slowly be introduced over the next 12 months. The database targets physicians, nurses, residents, and medical students.



MedPix® was originally developed by the Departments of Radiology and Biomedical Informatics at the Uniformed Services University, Bethesda, Maryland, USA.



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
