Mark Metzler enjoyed an outstanding year in research and creative endeavor. His article, titled "American Pressures for Financial Internationalization in Japan on the Eve of the Great Depression," appeared in the "Journal of Japanese Studies," a leading journal in the Japan studies field. Metzler also presented four papers at refereed conferences in New York, Ohio, Missouri and Korea, and submitted a book manuscript to a major publisher where it is currently under review.

In recognition of his work and promise as an emerging authority on the financial history of 20th century Japan, Metzler received two prestigious research grants: a Fulbright-Hays Faculty Research Abroad Fellowship and a Social Science Research Council/Japan Society for the Promotion of Science Fellowship. The Fulbright-Hays Faculty Research Abroad Fellowship enabled Metzler to spend a year at Tokyo University's Institute of Social Science constructing the first systematic and comparative account of postwar economic stabilization in Japan.
