## BUDGET CUTS AFFECT 64 UNIVERSITY POSITIONS

The university has initiated budget reductions which will cause an elimination of funding for positions in all employment categories. The cutbacks are a result of the current fiscal situation in the state of Michigan. Affected are 17.86 full-time equivalent faculty positions, 14.5 full-time equivalent administrative-professional positions, 19 full-time equivalent clerical-technical positions, 7 other full-time equivalent positions in the hourly, police officer and other categories, and 6 part-time athletic coaching positions.

"We anticipate that the actual number of employees to be laid off will be less than the number of positions affected," noted President Donald D. O'Dowd. "Some of the positions are currently vacant, and we will make every effort to place the employees who are in affected positions in other jobs in the university."

Lay-off notices for the initially affected employees (except faculty) will be sent in early May. The university is currently working with the leadership of the AAUP on the faculty lay-offs in accordance with the AAUP contract. In addition to the 17.86 faculty reduction, teaching by part-time faculty, academic administrators, and administrative-professional staff has been reduced by approximately 20 full-time equivalent positions for next year.

It is anticipated that additional lay-offs will be required in the near future. Governor Milliken has asked the Legislature to reduce appropriations for higher education institutions by another 2% for the 1975-76 fiscal year. That request is in addition to the 4% cut that the governor announced when he delivered his budget message in January. These actions would lead to a reduction in the university's appropriation of \$734,000.

The Senate and House appropriations committees are currently considering the governor's budget requests, and both houses of the Legislature have heard hearings on Oakland's proposed appropriation. There is no indication yet as to when a final decision on the appropriation will be made.

## **BOARD APPROVES HIKE IN 1975-76 ROOM AND BOARD**

Oakland University is raising its room and board rates effective with the summer term that starts June 23.

The action was approved by the OU Board of Trustees Wednesday, April 23. The increases reflect the rising costs of food, wages, and supplies. Residence hall operations are self-sustaining, OU officials said.

Room and board rates for the summer session will be \$398, up \$19 over summer of 1974, and a room-only option will cost \$249, a \$10 increase over last year. In addition, students in each category will pay a \$1 student government fee, the same amount charged last summer.

Room and board for the combined fall and winter semesters of 1975-76 will cost \$1,410, a hike of \$68 over 1974-75. A room only option costs \$880, an increase of \$38 over 1974-75. Each of the above classes of students will pay an \$8 student government fee, unchanged from last year.

Students living in the Anibal House Cooperative will pay \$205 for the summer session and \$712 for the fall and winter terms. The 1974-75 rates were \$195 for the summer and \$680 for the fall and winter semesters. Anibal House students do not pay the regular \$1 and \$8 student government fees.

## **APPLICATIONS NOW OPEN FOR FULBRIGHT-HAYS AWARDS**

William Schwab, campus adviser for the Fulbright-Hays program, announces that applications are now being accepted for the 1976-77 program.

## **COMMUNITY HOUSE CLOSES; SOME PROGRAMS CONTINUED**

Community House, the OU drug education and abuse center housed in the Oakland Center, will close June 30 due to lack of funding.

Kenneth H. Coffman, vice president for student affairs, said that specific segments of the Community House program will be continued by other offices. Commuter Services, room 118, of the Oakland Center, will handle referral services and the human awareness library. Student Organizations and Activities, room 48 of the OC, will take over educational programming, and the University-Community Counseling and Psychological Center in Graham Health Center will handle the Community House training programs.

It is clear that many of the concerns that prompted the initiation and continuation of Community House for the last three years still exist, Coffman said. He urged students to seek assistance from the offices listed above.
