

## **Resource Spotlight: Browzine**

If you missed our faculty brown bag session on 'Keeping Up with the Literature' on April 20, you're in luck! While PubMed and other databases are preferred for finding articles on a specific topic, for browsing the literature in a given field, we recommend Browzine!

Browzine replicates the experience of browsing through a library's physical periodical collection. You can:

- Skim current and available back issues of journals included in the library's subscriptions
- Easily access full-text PDFs from onand off-campus
- Personalize your Collections and Bookshelves on topics of your choice
- Download the app for Apple or Android devices, or use the web version


#### May Sessions:

## PubMed Search Tip of the Month: MyNCBI Part 2

In last month's newsletter, we covered setting up a MyNCBI account and customizing your display screen preferences, including highlighting your search terms and changing the number of citations displayed on each page. This month, we'll look at using MyNCBI help track the literature on a specific topic.

#### **Saving Citations:**

- 1. Run your search and then select relevant citation(s) by clicking the box above the citation number on the left side of the screen
- 2. Click on "Send to," located in the upper right side of the screen
- 3. Select "Clipboard" to save the citations temporarily (8 hours) or "Collections" to save the citations indefinitely.




#### Creating a Saved Search:

Once you have developed a search strategy that is giving you good results, you can save that search to run again later and set up email alerts to be notified automatically as new articles on your topic are published.

- 1. Run your search in PubMed
- 2. Click "Create Alert" under the search box
- A new screen will open, allowing you to rename your search and select whether you want to receive automatic email updates

You can access your collections and saved searches at any time through the "My NCBI" link in the upper right hand corner of every PubMed




