Policy shafts students — L.S. is B.S.

No OU students will be allowed to graduate this year due to a new Learning Skulls policy enacted last year and effective this week.

A notice of the change, per usual, was not given. The reason, according to university administrators who refused to be identified for fear of their lives, was that they "didn't have enough time."

The new policy requires that all students devise a proficiency test in redding, spelin, rithmentic (a new addition) and writing. Those students who fail to devise a more difficult, impossible test than the one currently offered are not allowed to graduate.

Students failing the test testing (according to sources, it is

impossible to pass) must take three cognate courses: useless rhetoric, sadio-masochism with the written word, and magazine reading. Passing these courses makes one eligible to graduate.

When asked about the new policy, Roy Sue Rodgers, congress president, declined comment, but was heard to moan, "no, no, not another three classes." She was last seen leafing through the Schedule of Classes, which was issued last week, two weeks after the start of the semester.

The fault, however, as one student affected by the change noted, lies not with Learning Skulls, but with the administration's failure to notify properly. "We get notices about tuition increases before they happen," she said, "but it takes them 14 months to warn us about stuff we don't need, and would violently protest against." When asked if that

meant that tuition increases were okay, she said, "Of course not, but if they're going to screw us, we'd like them to do it face to face, with money, with tuition—not behind our backs with increased class loads."

The Learning Skulls department was created five years ago when it was found that many OU students were entering college, and graduating without basic necessary talents.

According to people who get paid to know, however, the skills do not demand any standard way of teaching, since any professor from any department can teach, and in some cases, are required to teach, learning skulls classes.

When asked if this created confusion, Mounty Everest, chair and sofa person, said "Only among the students...for the faculty who need to teach another class to meet their requirements it's great."

O'Dowd wounded while leaving motel

OU President Donald O'Duck was shot last night while leaving the No-tell Motel with an unidentified university congress president.

Few details are known about the shooting or the reason O'Duck and the alleged woman were leaving the fleabag motel, but sources close to O'Bear said it was a place he frequented between 2 and 5 a.m. The source said he liked the ham and cheese omelette at their restaurant, and liked to rise early.

Among the possibilities named were: that he was shot by a crazed maniac defying authority, that he was shot by a sane student who finally saw the ultimate reality, that he was shot by Fred Obare because O'Dog didn't smile enough, or that he was shot by a normal administrator infuriated at being forced to listen to O'Sheep's State of the University Address.

Balloonist, who has unofficially run the university for years, will serve as interim president until he recovers or a new president can be selected.

Other informed members of the university community had other ideas as to identity and whereabouts of the gun-

Saga announces new fall menu

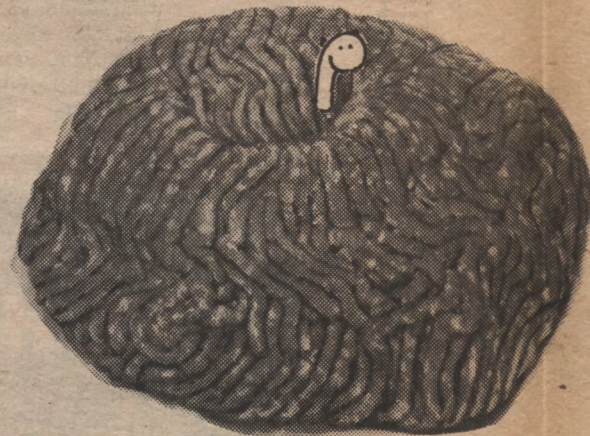
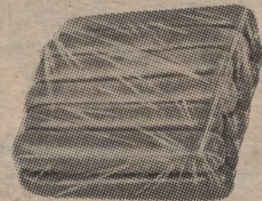
SAGA announced its new "Fall Features" this week and students seem excited over the expected additions to the menu.

Additional items included in the kit are: blindfolds, vomit-inducing juice and anti-bloating pills.

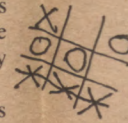

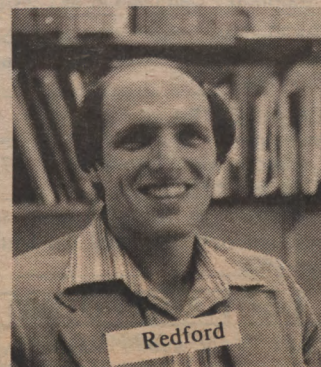
Several members of University Congress moved at last week's meeting, thus providing the only action that this body has taken to

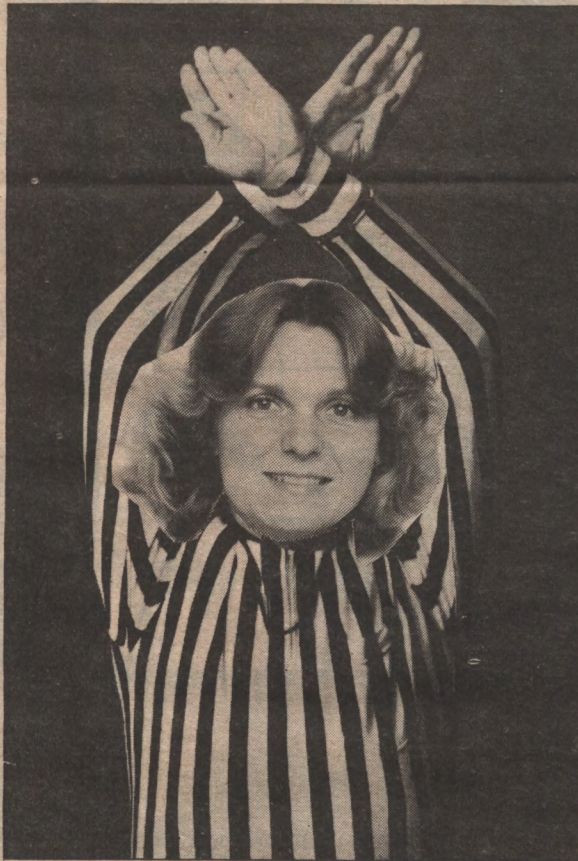
The Tauts have been placed on strict probation by the Oakland Center and the Office of Student Life, following the occurrence of an incident on Friday, March 23.

LIVINGSTON: Calls foul on Tauts.

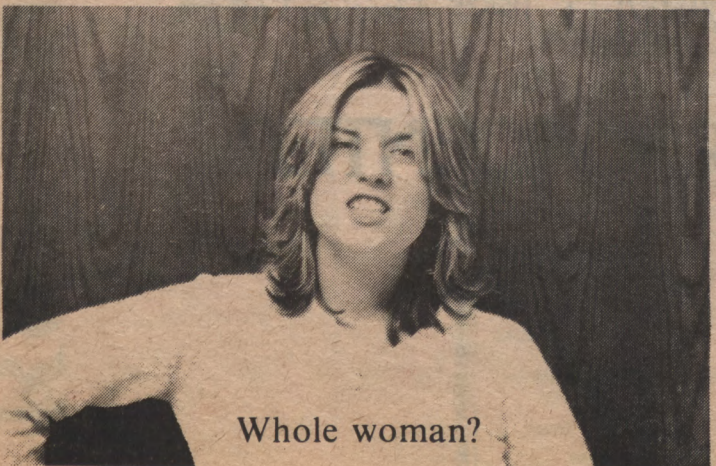
prostrate themselves thrice daily, and facing 49 O.C., chant "There is no god but CIPO, and Joe
