OU staff, student honored for saving man's life

The Southeastern Michigan Chapter of the **American Red Cross** recently honored two Oakland University staff members and an OU student for their efforts in saving the life of a man who had a heart attack at the Recreation Center.

Teri Eudy, assistant director for campus recreation; Terry Ross, Oakland University police officer, and OU student Michael Thom were honored June 20 at the Southeastern Michigan American Red Cross Annual Joint Meeting.

Eudy and Ross administered CPR while Thom assisted with deployment of a newly installed Automated External Defibrillator unit before advanced life support arrived.

The Red Cross had installed the AED units and provided training for the Recreation Center staff just prior to the incident.
