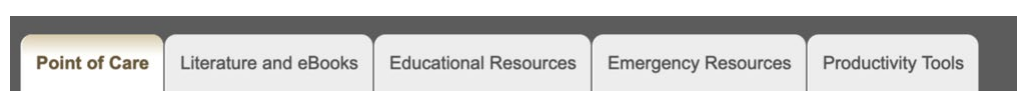

UpToDate - evidence-based clinical information on disease diagnosis, treatment, and screening designed for clinicians for use at point-of-care. **Free for OUWB users**



Micromedex - evidence-based drug information including adult and pediatric dosing, interactions, adverse reactions, contraindications, off-label indications, mechanism of action, and pricing/packaging. **Free for OUWB users**



Epocrates - Brand and generic drug monographs and formulary information. Includes adult and pediatrics dosing, interactions, adverse reactions, contraindications, off-label indications, mechanism of action, and pricing/packaging. **Free**

Service Tip of the Month: OUWB Publication Reports

The Medical Library routinely tracks and compiles bibliographies of the scholarly publications of its faculty, staff, and students. Publication reports are issued quarterly and compiled annually.

Works included in the reports are identified through searches run in the institutional affiliation fields of a variety of databases, including PubMed, Scopus, Web of Science, and CINAHL. We also rely on faculty to notify us when they have new publications – especially books and book chapters, since those materials are not well-indexed.

The quarterly reports also serve as a current awareness service and are a great way to see what your colleagues are doing across OUWB. The reports include links to full-text articles or to an interlibrary loan request form if we do not subscribe to a particular journal. The [January-March 2020 Publication List](#) includes 161 total items - 118 articles, 22 conference abstracts, 6 book chapters, and 35 student citations.

The [2019 OUWB Preliminary Publication List](#) (image above) contains 719 citations. It will be expanded and finalized once the Beaumont Research Institute publishes its 2019 Report of Research Accomplishments. At that time, we will compare our reports and add any citations by OUWB faculty we may have missed with our automated search process.

We compiled this bibliography to recognize the amount of scholarly activity, including journal articles, published meeting abstracts, book chapters, books, and other works written by OUWB faculty, students, and staff. We created the list by searching the institutional affiliation fields in PubMed, Scopus, Web of Science, CINAHL, Medline Plus, and Springer for all citations published in the 2019 calendar year. We then downloaded citations into an Endnote database, where we extracted and reformatted them for this report. We will update and supplement our report with additional citations when the Beaumont Research Institute publishes its 2019 Report of Research Accomplishments. Because of space limitations, this report does not represent an exhaustive list of all published works by OUWB authors.
