Weekly ERL Update: A Message from the Michigan School Library Advocacy Coalition

All of Michigan's students need equitable access to effective

school libraries staffed by certified school librarians. School librarians improve student achievement; lead and support technology integration; and improve college/career readiness as they teach research, digital citizenship and information literacy skills.

Studies in more than 20 states, including Michigan, show students with access to vibrant school library programs have higher student achievement, including higher reading scores. In particular, students who are economically disadvantaged, black, Hispanic or have disabilities benefit proportionally more than general students from the presence of a full-time certified school library media specialist. More details on these studies are available online.

Several school districts, including Eastpointe, Troy, Comstock and Mount Clemens, have added certified school librarian positions this year, and we look forward to more schools adding positions. Still, Michigan ranks 47th in the nation in the ratio of students to certified school librarians. Only 8% of Michigan schools employ a full-time certified school library media specialist. All students in our state deserve to have access to the services provided by a teacher-certified school librarian.
