ANIBAL HOUSE RESIDENTS IN CO-OP EXCHANGE PROGRAM

Oakland University students in the Anibal House cooperative are participating in a student co-op exchange program.

Visits are currently being exchanged with the Neill-Wycik co-op. The co-op is a 22-story high rise in downtown Toronto, Canada. The students in the co-op attend Ryerson Institute.

Students from Neill-Wycik came to OU the first weekend in February and OU students will go to Toronto in early March. The exchanges allow students to make new friends and to see how other co-op units are run, participants said.

BUS LINE PROPOSED OVER PONTIAC-MT. CLEMENS ROUTE

The Southeastern Michigan Transit Authority (SEMTA) indicates that within the next two months a proposed bus line linking the Pontiac, Rochester, Utica, and Mt. Clemens communities should be in operation.

The proposed route includes service to Oakland University and there will be connections with service to Detroit along Woodward and Gratiot Avenues.

Students are now being surveyed about their interest in a bus route, best schedule times, and appropriate fares. Faculty and staff will be receiving by campus mail a short questionnaire on which they may indicate their interest in bus service.
