New Interface for Library Mobile Apps

At our final Lunch 'n Learn of the year on April 14, we reviewed a number of library-provided and free mobile apps and heard about some interesting apps from you! Building off of that session, we're looking into new ways to display our current mobile resources page.

In the latest issue of Computers in Libraries
Magazine, Michael Blake from George Washington
University's Himmelfarb Health Sciences Library
described designing a mobile interface to their
mobile apps page that emulates an app store.
Eschewing the mobile interface used for the rest of
their website, they chose instead to treat this page
as a stand-alone resource with its own distinct
interface. The result is a simple, intuitive tool for
browsing and installing apps for Apple and Android
handheld devices.

The Medical Library has decided to follow the Himmelfarb Health Sciences Library's lead and use the open source software to create a similar **beta page** featuring our own apps. Register for a personal account while on campus for access to the full site and to track your progress.
	The Thieme Teaching Assistant is a web-based presentation tool providing access to images for download, manipulation, or live presentation.
?	Faculty can develop custom course materials which can be hosted on a protected intranet for their students. Students can use the resource for study and selftesting.
