


Student Success Fall Open House was a Huge Success!

Human Library - UNjudge Someone

Thursday, November 30 | 4:00 - 7:00pm | Kresge Library Main Floor

Please join us as the University Libraries invite you to "*Un*judge Someone." The idea behind this event is to "challenge stigma and stereotypes" by "creating a safe space for dialogue" about personal experiences surrounding prejudice, beliefs, disability, ethnicity, origin, orientation, etc.

It's set up like this: Human "books" representing groups in society that are often subjected to stigma or discrimination, offer conversation/dialogue to "readers" who may ask questions. The "books" will speak about their own personal experiences. The event format offers a way to challenge stereotypes and dispel misconceptions. During the event, the "books" are stationed at tables, and the "readers" will move through the "library," from book to book, learning from the stories/conversations as they go along.
