Art Gallery hosting Student-Faculty Exhibition

OU art students soon will have the chance to see their work next to that of their professors at the Seventh Annual Student-Faculty Exhibition.

The exhibition is being held at **Meadow Brook Art Gallery** (MBAG) April 12 through May 13. About 90 percent of the work will be by students.

Gallery Director Dick Goody says the show promotes interest in the College of Arts and Sciences' **Department of Art and Art History** and provides students with a professional venue to display their work.

"We can expect 4,000 to 5,000 people to see this exhibition," Goody says.

This year's jurors are Art and Art History instructors Lynn Galbreath and Sally Tardella. They will judge works in photography, drawing, painting, sculpture, video and three other categories: assemblage, usually three-dimensional relief pieces; mixed media, where objects are fastened onto flat surfaces; and installation, an exhibit such as a maze, in which viewers can walk.

The gallery is located across the hall from **Meadow Brook Theatre** in Wilson Hall and there is no cost for admission.

Gallery hours are noon-5 p.m. Tuesday through Friday and 1-5:30 p.m. Saturday and Sunday. During Meadow Brook Theatre performances, the gallery is open 7 p.m. through the first intermission Tuesday through Friday and 5:30 p.m. through the first intermission on Saturday and Sunday.
