Congratulations to both presenters for this accomplishment so early in their doctoral program!





Michigan eLibrary (MeL) provides all Michigan residents with access to Novelist, which is a great database for finding books for all ages and purposes.



There is a link to Novelist on the <u>ERL list of databases</u>, but you can also access it by going to the <u>MeL eResources web page</u>. You can type in a search phrase such as "read aloud" and then limit to age groups, theme, writing style, tone and more. Add additional search terms to narrow your focus. From the list of results, you can also see a list of more books like these as you select and investigate each title.

We also celebrate Women's History Month and Pride Month on campus in March. In honor of these celebrations, the ERL has created displays to highlight great literature for youth. The theme for Women's History Month this year is "Valient Women of the Vote." ### OUCARES Family Fun Day — Saturday, March 21


