OAKLAND UNIVERSITY

Oakland University is a state-funded, four-year institution with an enrollment of more than 11,500 students. Located midway between Rochester and Pontiac, Michigan, the university is approximately 30 miles from all the cultural and entertainment opportunities of America's fifth largest city—Detroit.

Oakland University was founded in 1957 when the late Mr. and Mrs. Alfred G. Wilson donated their 1,600-acre estate and \$2 million to Michigan State University to begin a new college in Oakland County. The university, named Michigan State-Oakland, enrolled its first students in 1959. In 1963 the name was changed to Oakland University and in 1970 the state legislature granted Oakland University its independence.

Since its inception, the university has been committed to offering a diverse set of academic programs. Anchored by a strong liberal arts program, the university is organized into a College of Arts and Sciences, and Schools of Economics and Management, Human and Educational Services, Performing Arts, Engineering, Nursing, a Center for General and Career Studies, a Center for Health Sciences, and a Center for Community and Human Development.

The athletic program strives for continued success in achieving its educational goal of providing total participation within a framework of excellence. Under the guidance of the Director of Athletics Corey Van Fleet, Oakland University's athletic department has 12 sports and offers cardio-vascular rehabilitation and physiology laboratory programs including prescriptive exercises and stress testing.

The Hollie Lepley Sports Center houses a range of facilities for individual and team activities including: a swimming pool; courts for handball, paddleball, badminton, squash, basketball and volleyball; a wrestling room; and an updated weight room. There is also an 18-hole golf course, eight excellent outdoor tennis courts and several well-groomed playing fields. These facilities combined with the university's beautiful wooded landscape and rolling fields make the Oakland campus one of the most ideal environments for sports activities.

Oakland University is a member of the NCAA Division II and the AIAW Division I and the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference. Its academic programs are accredited by the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools.

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1980-81 WOMEN'S BASKETBALL OUTLOOK

A new era for Oakland University women's basketball starts this season as DeWayne Jones begins his first year at the helm of one of the university's most successful athletic programs.

Jones replaces Rose Swidzinski, who compiled a five-year record of 67-50. To help in the transition, Jones, the only male women's basketball coach in the state of Michigan, welcomes back seven players, including four starters from last year's 17-11 AIAW regional qualifying team.

Sophomores Linda Krawford, a 5-11 forward, and Teresa Vondrasek, a 5-10 center, started all 28 games last year and each had banner seasons. Krawford was the team's second-leading scorer with a 14.9 average, while Vondrasek was OU's third-leading scorer (11.4) and second-leading rebounder (10.4). Sophomore guards Anne Kish and Kelly Kenny will give Jones a solid backcourt. Kish scored at an 11.3 pace and dished out 105 assists last winter, while Kenny led the team with 115 assists and averaged 6.6 points.

Jones will be looking for a fifth starter to replace all-American Helen Shereda, who was the nation's third-leading scorer and fourth-leading rebounder and a first round draft choice by the New Jersey Gems in the Women's Professional Basketball League.

The leading contenders for that fifth opening are junior forward Beth Brunn, who saw action in 26 games last season, sophomore center Cordella Donner and sophomore forward Lynda Axsom. Donner played in 18 games last winter, missing the last nine contests with a broken foot, while Axsom played in 21 games and averaged 2.1 points.

Jones also recruited three freshmen—guard Pam Springer and forwards Helen McGraw and Ulla Vincents. Springer averaged 20.5 points and 7.8 rebounds at Bedford High School, while McGraw was an all-state performer at Warren High School. Vincents is from Denmark where she made the Denmark National Team. Jones also grabbed a pair of walk-ons in Gay Richardson and Alesia Tyson.

If Jones' past record is any indication of his potential, Oakland University women's basketball should continue to be one of the Midwest's top basketball programs.



COREY VAN FLEET

Director of Athletics

Corey Van Fleet was named director of athletics at Oakland University in 1972. Upon his arrival at OU in 1965, he was swimming coach for the Pioneers until 1979 when he stepped down to devote his full-time duties to the ever-increasing job of director of athletics.

He has, however, remained active in swimming on the high school level by serving as an official at high school meets. He also officiates for the Big Ten Conference, the National Collegiate

Athletic Association (NCAA), the Amateur Athletic Union (AAU) meets, and the Olympic Trials.

A native of Battle Creek, Michigan, he received his bachelor of science degree (1959) and his master of science degree (1971) in physical education from Wayne State University. He also has completed course work in a doctoral program at Florida State University.

His recent honors include: the Matt Mann Swimming Coach Award from the Michigan High School Coaches Association; appointment to the board of directors, American Red Cross, U.S. Olympic Swimming Committee; the Master Coach Award from the Michigan Amateur Athletic Union. Van Fleet is also a member of the YMCA National Aquatics Board of Directors, a member of the Rochester Rotary Club, past president of the College Swimming Coaches of America, Inc., and an active member in the NCAA and AIAW governing bodies.

An associate professor of education with tenure, Van Fleet and his wife, Mary, have one son and live in Rochester.

GREG SMITH

Sports Information Director

Greg Smith is in his second year as sports information director at Oakland University after serving for two years as SID at Valparaiso University in Valparaiso, Indiana.

Smith's 1980 OU swimming brochure was judged second-best in the nation by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA).

The 25-year-old SID received his Bachelor of Science degree in Public Relations Journalism in 1977 from Bowling Green State University (BGSU) in Bowling Green, Ohio. While a student at BGSU, he was a sports

information assistant for four years, assistant sports editor for the **BG News**, the campus newspaper, and a sports writer for the **Bowling Green Sentinel-Tribune**. He was also president and founder of the Sports Information Club at BGSU. In addition, his experience includes sports writing for the **Findlay Courier**.

Smith is a member of CoSIDA and the Detroit Sports Broadcasters Association. He is a bachelor and lives in Pontiac.



HEAD COACH DEWAYNE JONES



DeWayne Jones enters his first year as head coach of the women's basketball team at Oakland University this season.

Jones, who graduated from Ferndale High School in 1969, attended Northern Michigan University where he received both his bachelor of science degree in special education in 1973 and his master's degree in learning disabilities in 1975. While at NMU he played three years for coach Glen Brown and was named the team's most valuable player during his junior year and the team captain during his final season.

The 27-year-old head coach returned to his high school alma mater to coach the girls' varsity and junior varsity teams in 1976-77. He led the Eagles to a 19-2 mark in 1976 and a 17-4 record in 1977. Jones gained two Southeastern Michigan Association championships and two district crowns.

During the Ferndale High School 1977-78 boys' basketball season, Jones assumed the head coaching duties after the coach resigned. He coached only four games that season, winning two. In the 1978-79 season Jones guided the team to an 11-10 record before leading the Eagles to a 20-4 record last year and their first Southeastern Michigan Association League Championship in 10 years and their first district title in eight years. For his efforts Jones was named the **Royal Oak Tribune** 1980 Coach of the Year and the **Detroit News**, Metro North, 1980 Coach of the Year.

Jones and his wife have three children and live in Pontiac.

COACH PAT GRAVES



Pat Graves begins her first year as assistant women's basketball coach at Oakland University this winter.

A 1974 graduate of Central Michigan University with a bachelor of science degree, Graves served as junior varsity coach at Capac High School in Capac, Michigan from 1974-78. During that time her teams compiled a 54-14 mark including an undefeated 1976-77 campaign and three league championships. She also served as assistant varsity coach and her teams had a four-year record of 57-10 and two district championships.

In 1979 Graves led the Utica Eisenhower High School team to a 13-4 first-place record. Before accepting her position at OU, she was the assistant varsity coach at Utica Eisenhower High School.

A holder of a master of arts degree from Oakland University in guidance and counseling in secondary schools in 1979, Graves will continue to teach at Van Hoosen Junior High School in Rochester.

Graves, a veteran of conducting summer basketball camps, is single and lives in Rochester.
