He worked with undergraduate and graduate conducting students and with the Oakland Chorale. Director of choral studies **Mike Mitchell** said, "It was an amazing experience." Mr. Carrington was a founding member of the King's Singers, a group that gave 3,000 performances at the world's most prestigious festivals and concert halls, made more than seventy recordings, and appeared on countless television and radio programs, including nine appearances on the Tonight Show with the late Johnny Carson!
